Key States Work To Secure Capitol Buildings In Advance Of Possible Protests

<u>CNN</u>² (1/12, Levenson) reports that "States across the country are increasing security at their capitol buildings ahead of what the FBI has warned are 'armed protests' being planned at all 50 state capitols," noting that "the FBI's bulletin was not publicly released but was leaked to reporters." CNN outlines the steps some states are taking to prepare for possible protests, including Michigan introducing a ban on open-carry at its capitol; Wisconsin authorizing its state National Guard; and Pennsylvania closing its capitol to the public.

Nearly 100 Arrested So Far In Probe Of US Capitol Violence

<u>USA Todax</u> (1/12, Penzenstadler, Salman, Wedell) reports, "Nearly 100 people have been arrested so far for their roles in the attack" on the US Capitol building on January 6. "Many currently face lesser charges such as unlawful entry, disorderly conduct and defacing public property. Only a few have been accused of more serious crimes such as felony violations of the Riot Act." The <u>Wall Street Journal</u> (1/12, Gurman, Viswanatha, Subscription Publication) reports FBI Washington field office Assistant Director in Charge Steven D'Antuono said the FBI has opened more than 160 case files and has received more than 100,000 videos and other forms of digital media related to the attacks.

<u>Reuters</u>^{*} (1/12, Hosenball, Beech) reports Acting US Attorney Michael Sherwin said at a news briefing, "I think the scope and scale of this investigation and these cases are really unprecedented, not only in FBI history, but probably DOJ history. The Capitol grounds outside and inside are essentially a crime scene." The <u>New York Times</u>^{*} (1/12, Shear, Goldman, Benner) reports Sherwin's comments "came as evidence mounted that before the grim events at the Capitol – in which lawmakers and others hid from an angry, surging mob and five people died in the riot and nearby tumult – top officials in government had reason to be deeply concerned about the possibility of violence."

Law Enforcement Agencies Prepare Unprecedented Security Precautions For Inauguration

The <u>Washington Post</u> (1/12) reports, "Pentagon leaders must balance an array of threats on state capitols nationwide against the potential for renewed extremist violence in Washington, D.C., as they consider security plans ahead of Presidentelect Joe Biden's inauguration, senior officials said Tuesday." The Post adds, "Intelligence suggesting the potential for armed riots or attacks on state capitols across the country came into focus as the Defense Department scrambled to ensure an adequate plan for providing National Guard aid for the Jan. 20 inauguration and avoid a repeat of last week's insurrection at the U.S. Capitol. Neighboring states may need to reserve National Guard to protect their own facilities and personnel, possibly limiting the ability of the Defense Department, which oversees the D.C. National Guard, to call on them for additional help."

The <u>New York Times</u> (1/12, Cooper, Goldman) reports that McCarthy has decided that "National Guard troops who are flooding into Washington to secure the Capitol for Inauguration Day will be armed. ... The armed troops will be responsible for security around the Capitol building complex."

Pentagon Weighs Preparation For Threats In State Capital Cities With DC Threats. The Washington Post

(1/12) reports Defense Department leaders said Tuesday that they "must balance an array of threats on state capitols nationwide against the potential for renewed extremist violence in Washington. ... Intelligence suggesting the potential for armed riots or attacks on state capitols across the country came into focus as the Defense Department scrambled to ensure an

adequate plan for providing National Guard aid for the Jan. 20 inauguration and avoid a repeat of last week's insurrection at the U.S. Capitol."

Pennsylvania State Police Begin Collecting Data To Identify Policing Disparities

The <u>Beaver County (PA) Times</u> (1/12, Suttles) reports, "Pennsylvania State Police have launched a new data collection program designed to identify patterns of racial and ethnic disparities in policing. Col. Robert Evanchick, state police commissioner, said his agency began collecting information such as driver and passenger age, gender, race and ethnicity during traffic stops on Jan 1. – regardless of whether the encounter results in a citation or written warning." According to the Times, "Troopers record the duration of the stop, whether a vehicle search was conducted and the results of that search, as well. The data will be analyzed by researchers at the University of Cincinnati to identify potential patterns of racial and ethnic disparities in policing and, if appropriate, make recommended changes to policy or training."

Indiana Law Enforcement Reform Bill Earns Bipartisan Support

The <u>AP</u> (1/12, Smith) reports from Indianapolis, Indiana, "A bipartisan bill aimed at increasing police accountability and enacting criminal justice reform received early support from Indiana's legislators, Iaw enforcement leaders and community groups Tuesday, following calls for action from the Indiana Black Legislative Caucus." The bill, "which was unanimously approved by the House Courts and Criminal Code Committee, includes provisions for mandatory de-escalation training, misdemeanor penalties for officers who turn off body cameras with intent to conceal, and bans on chokeholds in certain circumstances. The bill would also establish a procedure for the law enforcement training board to decertify officers who commit misconduct, and would ease the sharing of officers' employment records between police departments, thus helping to identify 'bad actors' and keep them from moving jobs. The legislation now heads to the full House."

Los Angeles Police Commission Approves New Oversight Of Facial Recognition Technology

The Los Angeles Times (1/12, Rector) reports, "The Los Angeles Police Commission approved a policy Tuesday that set new parameters on the LAPD's use of facial recognition technology, but stopped far short of the outright ban sought by many city activists." The Times adds, "The move followed promises by the commission to review the Los Angeles Police Department's use of photo-comparison software in September, after The Times reported that officers had used the technology – contrary to department claims – more than 30,000 times since 2009." The new policy "restricts LAPD detectives and other trained officers to using a single software platform operated by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, which only uses mugshots and is far less expansive than some third-party search platforms," and "also mandates new measures for tracking the Police Department's use of the county system and its outcomes in the crime fight."

Montana Lawmakers Consider Bill To Allow Domestic Violence Recordings As Evidence

The <u>AP</u> (1/12) reports, "Montana lawmakers are considering a bill that would allow victims of domestic violence to secretly record phone calls or interactions with the perpetrator and use the recordings as evidence in court." The AP adds, "Under Montana law, it is illegal to record a conversation without the knowledge of all the parties involved," and "that means such recordings can't be used as evidence in prosecuting domestic violence and other criminal cases." The bill "would create an exception to the privacy law to allow recording of physical or mental abuse against the person or a member of their family."

FBI Agent Infiltrated Group Allegedly Plotting To Kidnap Michigan Governor

<u>WXMETY</u> Grand Rapids, MI (1/12, Martin) reports, "Court transcripts released in the alleged Governor Whitmer kidnapping conspiracy say that an FBI agent infiltrated the group claiming to be an explosives expert." The FBI agent "was only able to get into the group after one of the members got cold feet about the plan and went to a local police department with his concerns." The defendants in the case face "federal charges of conspiracy to commit kidnapping." The transcripts unscaled Tuesday "reveal that the group participated in an additional, highly intricate dry run of the kidnapping, all under the cover of night in mid-September." The FBI agent "was along for the trip," and "told the group that they would need about \$4,000 worth of explosives to knock the bridge out."

German Authorities Shut Down Massive Darknet Marketplace

The <u>AP</u>⁻⁻⁻⁻⁻ (1/12) reports, "German prosecutors said Tuesday that they have taken down what they believe was the biggest illegal marketplace on the darknet and arrested its suspected operator." The AP adds, "The site, known as DarkMarket, was shut down on Monday, prosecutors in the southwestern city of Koblenz said. All sorts of drugs, forged money, stolen or forged credit cards, anonymous mobile phone SIM cards and malware were among the things offered for sale there, they added. German investigators were assisted in their months-long probe by U.S. authorities and by Australian, British, Danish, Swiss, Ukrainian and Moldovan police." The marketplace "had nearly 500,000 users and more than 2,400 vendors, prosecutors said. They added that it processed more than 320,000 transactions, and Bitcoin and Monero cryptocurrency to the value of more than 140 million euros (\$170 million) were exchanged."

TECHNOLOGY

Extremists On Encrypted Channels Calling For Inauguration Day Violence

<u>NBC News</u> (1/12) reports, "Right-wing extremists are using encrypted channels to call for violence against government officials" on inauguration day. In Telegram chatrooms, "where white supremacist content has been freely shared for months," extremists are "sharing knowledge of how to make, conceal and use homemade guns and bombs."

Damage Persists After Jersey City Cyber Attack Threatened "Public Health Crisis"

The <u>Hudson County (NJ) Jersey Journal</u> (1/12, D'Auna) reports, "The recent cyberattack at the Jersey City Municipal Utilities Authority inflicted damage that lasted months and threatened to cause a 'public health crisis," it said. Officials "have said little about the Sept. 30 ransomware attack, which MUA documents said blocked access to 'vital' water and sewer information." At a December meeting, the "MUA Board of Commissioners voted to approve a new \$391,000 emergency contract with cyber security firm Digital Team Six" that they called "necessary to avert a public health crisis." However, the "extent of the potential 'public health crisis' is unclear." Jersey City Mayor Steve Fulop wrote in an op-ed last September that they are "the only municipal police department on the eastern seaboard with police officers assigned to the FBI Cyber Security Task Force."

Experts Warn British Columbia's Vaccine Supply Vulnerable To Cyber Attacks

The <u>Vancouver (CAN) Sun</u> (1/13, Robinson) reports that Pure Storage executive Shawn Rosemarin "says a successful attack" on British Columbia's vaccination program "could bring the province's immunization drive to a standstill, delaying vaccinations, and putting people at risk." BC health officer Dr. Bonnie Henry "underscored the cyber security risk, telling reporters B.C. was aware of national and international information 'that there has been a concerted effort to try and interrupt the cold chain, for example, and to sabotage immunization programs." According to Rosemarin, the "impact of a successful cyberattack on the vaccination program would be huge, and the monetary value of such an attack would be very high." Nationwide, the "Canadian Centre for Cyber Security released a bulletin on the continued impact of COVID-19 on cyber threat activity" last month.

The <u>New York Times</u> (1/12, Shear, Goldman, Benner) reports Sherwin's comments "came as evidence mounted that before the grim events at the Capitol – in which lawmakers and others hid from an angry, surging mob and five people died in the riot and nearby tumult – top officials in government had reason to be deeply concerned about the possibility of violence."

Law Enforcement Agencies Prepare Unprecedented Security Precautions For Inauguration

The <u>Washington Post</u> (1/12) reports, "Pentagon leaders must balance an array of threats on state capitols nationwide against the potential for renewed extremist violence in Washington, D.C., as they consider security plans ahead of Presidentelect Joe Biden's inauguration, senior officials said Tuesday." The Post adds, "Intelligence suggesting the potential for armed riots or attacks on state capitols across the country came into focus as the Defense Department scrambled to ensure an adequate plan for providing National Guard aid for the Jan. 20 inauguration and avoid a repeat of last week's insurrection at the U.S. Capitol. Neighboring states may need to reserve National Guard to protect their own facilities and personnel, possibly limiting the ability of the Defense Department, which oversees the D.C. National Guard, to call on them for additional help."

The <u>New York Times</u> (1/12, Cooper, Goldman) reports that McCarthy has decided that "National Guard troops who are flooding into Washington to secure the Capitol for Inauguration Day will be armed. ... The armed troops will be responsible for security around the Capitol building complex."


'A vote of conscience.' Five House Republicans explain why they will vote to impeach Trump today.

No matter how you look at her decision, Rep. Liz Cheney (R-Wyo.) supporting the impeachment of President Trump took immense political courage. A new CBS-YouGov poll shows 55 percent of Americans favor impeachment, but just 15 percent of Republicans do. In November, the president carried her state with 70 percent of the vote. The leader of the Freedom Caucus and other Trump loyalists quickly called for Cheney's ouster as the No. 3 in House GOP leadership. The No. 1 and No. 2 on the leadership team oppose impeachment. The single article that has been introduced, for "incitement of insurrection," already had the support of 218 House Democrats, enough to ensure its passage without her walking the plank. Even if no action is taken, Trump will be out of the White House in seven days.

Taken together, these factors make the statement Cheney issued Tuesday all the more remarkable. The 54-year-old has offered perhaps the most forceful and eloquent case of any lawmaker in either party for removing Trump from office over his behavior last week.

"Much more will become clear in coming days and weeks, but what we know now is enough," Cheney wrote. "The President of the United States summoned this mob, assembled the mob, and lit the flame of this attack. Everything that followed was his doing. None of this would have happened without the President. The President could have immediately and forcefully intervened to stop the violence. He did not. There has never been a greater betrayal by a President of the United States of his office and his oath to the Constitution."

During a Monday evening conference call with Republicans, Cheney hinted at where she was heading. "This is going to be a vote of conscience," the congresswoman told the members, according to two people who were on the private call.


Cheney's decision had its roots in a dramatic phone call from her father, Dick Cheney, who was watching events unfold on television last Wednesday. The former vice president called to warn her that the president had criticized her by name during his speech on the Ellipse, Michael Kranish reports. "We got to get rid of the weak congresspeople, the ones that aren't any good, the Liz Cheneys of the world," Trump told the crowd that would soon storm the Capitol.

Cheney's announcement has created a permission structure for other members to follow her lead. Four other House Republicans announced Tuesday that they will vote to impeach Trump when the vote comes up on the floor later today. Here are the rationales they have offered in their statements:

"To allow the President of the United States to incite this attack without consequence is a direct threat to the future of our democracy. For that reason, I cannot sit by without taking action," wrote Rep. John Katko (N.Y.), the top Republican on the House Homeland Security Committee and a former federal prosecutor. "It cannot be ignored that President Trump encouraged this insurrection – both on social media ahead of January 6th, and in his speech that day. By deliberately promoting baseless theories suggesting the election was somehow stolen, the president created a combustible environment of misinformation, disenfranchisement, and division. When this manifested in violent acts on January 6th, he refused to promptly and forcefully call it off, putting countless lives in danger. ...

"The divide in our country is more clear than ever before," Katko added. "I hear my Republican colleagues in their argument that impeachment only further divides our country at a time when we must move forward. I agree. There must be a continuance of government and a peaceful transition of power. But I also believe firmly that I must follow the law and the facts and hold this President accountable for his actions."



Rep. Fred Upton (R-Mich.) complained that Trump showed no contrition when he spoke on Tuesday and described his speech from last week's rally on the Ellipse as "totally appropriate."


"He expressed no regrets for last week's violent insurrection at the U.S. Capitol," Upton wrote. "This sends exactly the wrong signal to those of us who support the very core of our democratic principles and took a solemn oath to the Constitution. I would have preferred a bipartisan, formal censure rather than a drawn-out impeachment process. I fear this will now interfere with important legislative business and a new Biden Administration. But it is time to say: Enough is enough. The Congress must hold President Trump to account and send a clear message that our country cannot and will not tolerate any effort by any President to impede the peaceful transfer of power from one President to the next."

Rep. Adam Kinzinger (R-Ill.) wondered: "If these actions – the Article II branch inciting a deadly insurrection against the Article I branch – are not worthy of impeachment, then what is an impeachable offense?"

"We are in unchartered waters here, and in a moment in history we have not experienced in modern times," Kinzinger wrote. "There is no doubt in my mind that the President of the United States broke his oath of office and incited this insurrection. He used his position in the Executive to attack the Legislative." Rep. Jaime Herrera Beutler (R-Wash.) faulted the president for not just inciting the mob but saying kind words about those who stormed the Capitol:

This is already a significant shift from December 2019 when Democrats impeached Trump on a party line vote for urging Ukraine to announce investigations into Joe Biden and his son. "A senior administration official said **the White House expects at least a dozen Republicans to support impeachment in the likely House vote Wednesday.** The White House is rudderless, unwilling or unable to mount any defense other than saying that Trump will already be leaving next week," Mike DeBonis, Josh Dawsey and Seung Min Kim report. "Trump, banned from Twitter, for the first time lacks the ability to aim angry tweets at those who oppose him, and White House officials conceded that he has few ways to stem the tide. ...

"Meanwhile, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.) has been telling associates since the attack that Trump probably committed **impeachable offenses**, as first reported by the New York Times. McConnell, a close adviser said, has not decided how he will vote on impeachment and wants to hear the case first. McConnell has not returned Trump's calls in weeks and remains livid with him, and he will not pressure his colleagues to oppose or support convicting the president. "He's not going to whip the vote," said the adviser, who spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss private conversations. A McConnell spokesman declined to comment."



On Tuesday night, the House passed a resolution on a 223-to-205 vote calling on Vice President Pence and the Cabinet to use their powers under the 25th Amendment to remove Trump immediately. They did so despite Pence sending an open letter to Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.) saying that he would not invoke the 25th. "Last week, I did not yield to pressure to exert power beyond my constitutional authority to determine the outcome of the election," Pence wrote in the letter, "and I will not now yield to efforts in the House of Representatives to play political games at a time so serious in the life of our Nation."


Pelosi signaled her confidence that the impeachment resolution will pass by announcing the nine Democratic "managers" who will serve prosecutors during the second Senate impeachment trial. The group will be led by Rep. Jamie Raskin (D-Md.). The others will be Reps. Diana DeGette (Colo.), David Cicilline (R.I.), Joaquin Castro (Texas), Eric Swalwell (Calif.), Ted Lieu (Calif.), Stacey Plaskett (V.I.), Joe Neguse (Colo.) and Madeleine Dean (Pa.).

Five moderate House Republicans have publicly endorsed censure as an alternative to impeachment, but there is little appetite for this among Democrats. The group, led by Reps. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-Pa.) and Tom Reed (R-N.Y.), introduced a censure resolution that criticized Trump fort trying to "unlawfully overturn" the election. The other Republicans who signed onto this measure are Reps. Young Kim (Calif.), John Curtis (Utah) and Peter Meijer (Mich.). Upton also joined the group, but a few hours later came out for impeachment.

"Both Democrat and Republican Members of the U.S. Senate are convinced that the House's impeachment efforts will almost certainly result in a second acquittal of President Trump, which would even further divide and inflame tensions in our nation," Fitzpatrick said in a statement. "There are two constitutional purposes of impeachment: 1) removal from office, and 2) barring the future holding of office. The **The Taw enforcement response** current approach being advanced by House leadership is certain to accomplish neither one of these."

The Secret Service takes command today of all security preparations for the inauguration.

The agency will be backed by as many as 15,000 National Guard troops, thousands of police and tactical officers, and layers of eight-foot steel fencing. "The high-alert security posture is starting six days earlier than planned," Carol Leonnig, Karoun Demirjian, Justin Jouvenal and Nick Miroff report. "Everyone can just rest assured they are throwing the kitchen sink at this event,' said one Secret Service official involved in protective planning ... The accelerated timetable has also allowed authorities to fortify the city and deploy officers in anticipation of potential violence on Sunday, when pro-Trump groups are calling for armed marches in Washington and the 50 state capitals. Veteran Secret Service and Homeland Security officials ... described a level of concern unlike anything in their careers.

"Threats they fear include a plot by armed groups to encircle the White House or the U.S. Capitol and the inauguration event, as well as the possibility that **gunmen could stage coordinated attacks against less-fortified targets in the city.** ... On Tuesday, police in the Chicago suburbs arrested 45-year-old Louis Capriotti, charging him with making threats to lawmakers last year in which authorities say he promised to kill any Democrat who attempted to enter the White House on Inauguration Day. ... While the Department of Homeland Security, which includes the Secret Service, is lacking key leadership following the resignation of acting secretary Chad Wolf on Monday, officials say they can rely on the experience of some the major players involved in inauguration security planning. ... The Secret Service has sent out a call to all of its field offices around the country to send agents to Washington for the week. ...

"Inside the Secret Service, senior supervisors have long been worried about the ability of an armed or organized group to pierce the White House fortress. An unwelcome reminder of that risk came on May 29. Protective detail agents rushed Trump to the White House's underground bunker that night, as crowds of demonstrators protesting the killing of George Floyd converged on the White House's north side and many pushed over temporary barricades meant to keep them farther away from the fence. ... Researchers are finding that right-wing extremists of all stripes have migrated to the encrypted messaging app Telegram, especially since social media site Parler was forced off the Internet when its cloud provider, Amazon, dropped it Monday. They're sharing diagrams on how to mount an ambush, talking about mobilizing on the days leading up to Inauguration Day and are posting messages exhorting people to 'descend on DC' and 'stick to your guns...'"

• YouTube suspended Trump from uploading new videos to his official accounts for at least a week, joining Twitter and Facebook in shutting the president out

of his account "in light of concerns about the ongoing potential for violence." It will also disable comments on his channel indefinitely. (Rachel Lerman)

- "Intelligence suggesting the potential for armed riots or attacks on state governments across the country came into focus as the Defense Department scrambled to ensure an adequate plan for providing National Guard aid for the Jan. 20 inauguration," Missy Ryan, Dan Lamothe and Paul Sonne report.
 "Neighboring states may need to reserve National Guard members to protect their own facilities and personnel."
- The Joint Chiefs of Staff, the group of the most senior uniformed leaders at the Pentagon, issued a highly unusual force-wide statement condemning the riot at the Capitol as a "direct assault" on the constitutional process and affirming Biden will become the 46th commander in chief. "The Joint Chiefs said that they witnessed actions inside the Capitol that were inconsistent with the rule of law and that the rights to freedom of speech and assembly 'do not give anyone the right to resort to violence, sedition and insurrection,!" Sonne reports.
- Secretary of State Mike Pompeo abruptly canceled his final trip abroad as the nation's top diplomat while some of his aides were already on the ground in Belgium for his first stop. Pompeo also reportedly planned to visit Luxembourg on Thursday, but the meeting fell through after the country's foreign minister called Trump a "political pyromaniac" and a "criminal" for inciting the rioters. (John Hudson)

The FBI warned of a "war" at the Capitol in advance of the mayhem.

"A day before rioters stormed Congress, an FBI office in Virginia issued an explicit warning that extremists were preparing to travel to Washington to commit violence and 'war,' according to an internal document reviewed by The Post that contradicts a senior official's declaration the bureau had no intelligence indicating anyone at last week's demonstrations in support of Trump planned to do harm," Devlin Barrett and Matt Zapotosky report. "A situational information report approved for release the day before the U.S. Capitol riot painted a dire portrait of dangerous plans, including individuals sharing a map of the complex's tunnels, and possible rally points for would-be conspirators to meet in Kentucky, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts and South Carolina and head in groups to Washington. ... Yet even with that information in hand, the report's unidentified author expressed concern that the FBI might be encroaching on free-speech rights.

"The warning is the starkest evidence yet of the sizable intelligence failure ... The head of the FBI's Washington Field Office, Steven D'Antuono, told reporters on Friday that the agency did not have intelligence suggesting the pro-Trump rally would be anything more than a lawful demonstration. ... Steven Sund, who resigned as Capitol Police chief, said in an interview Tuesday that he never received nor was made aware of the FBI's field bulletin."


The Justice Department creates a sedition and conspiracy task force to bring rioters to justice.

"The investigation, one of the largest ever undertaken by the department, includes counterterrorism and counterintelligence facets and has led to charges against more than 70 people and identified 170 suspects to date, acting U.S. attorney Michael R. Sherwin of D.C. said. Those arrest figures are expected to increase into the hundreds, if not 'exponentially," Spencer Hsu, Keith Alexander and Shayna Jacobs report. "But Sherwin and [D'Antuono] said any impression that prosecutors have mostly charged misdemeanor Capitol trespassing and D.C. curfew offenses is misleading. They said the cases are only the beginning and that U.S. authorities are investigating everything including the plundering of congressional offices and digital devices, assaults on law enforcement officers, and theft of national security and defense information, in addition to felony murder and excessive use of force. 'The gamut of cases is mind-blowing,' Sherwin said. ... Capitol and D.C. police were in openhanded combat with rioters, tear gas was used against police, and destructive devices and semiautomatic weapons have been recovered, he said. ... A new grand jury was empaneled Friday and met Monday to hear new Capitol breach cases. Prosecutors also condemned violence against the news media, saying they would investigate and hold accountable those who assault, threaten or damage the property of journalists.

"Hours before officials spoke, **the first public federal indictment in the Capitol breach was filed against an Alabama man who allegedly brought 11 molotov cocktails and five loaded weapons to the U.S. Capitol**. In an indictment dated Monday, Lonnie L. Coffman, 70, who was previously charged with two counts in a U.S. Capitol Police complaint, was charged with 16 counts of D.C. firearms violations and one federal firearms count. He also possessed a crossbow, several machetes, a stun gun and smoke devices, prosecutors said. ... Exhibits filed by prosecutors seeking to detain Coffman show he allegedly possessed handwritten notes, including one quoting Abraham Lincoln who once wrote in opposition to slavery, 'We The People Are The Rightful Masters Of Both The Congress And The Courts, Not To Overthrow The Constitution But To Overthrow The Men Who Pervert The Constitution.' ... Other charges made public included ones against Aaron Mostofsky, 34, the son of a Brooklyn judge who was photographed inside the Capitol wearing what appear to be fur pelts, a Capitol Police bulletproof vest and a riot shield."

- Swimmer Klete Keller, a five-time Olympic medalist and former teammate of Michael Phelps, was among the throng of rioters who stormed the Capitol. His Team USA jacket gave him away. (Rick Maese)
- Several users of the far-right social network Parler appear to have penetrated deep inside the Capitol and into areas normally restricted to the public, according to GPS metadata linked to 618 videos posted to the platform on the day of the riot. (Gizmodo)
- Retired Navy SEAL Adam Newbold is facing questions from the FBI after boasting in a Facebook video about "breaching the Capitol." (ABC News)
- William Watson, a 23-year-old Alabama resident who stormed the Capitol, was taken into federal custody for violating his bond on a previous charge by traveling to Washington. (ABC6)
- Andrew Williams, a firefighter-paramedic in Florida, was arrested for unlawful entry of a restricted building and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds after a photo surfaced of him wearing a Trump 2020 hat and pointing at a placard for Pelosi while inside the Capitol. (CNN)
- Local authorities say D.C. Officer Daniel Hodges, who was crushed in a door while responding to the riot, will live. (Fox 5)
- Many of the rioters identified so far had no party affiliation and voted sporadically, if at all, especially before 2016. (Bloomberg Businessweek)

Cascading political fallout



A few Democrats think some of their GOP colleagues had advance knowledge of the plot.

Rep. Mikie Sherrill (D-N.J.) alleged that some GOP members of Congress led people through the Capitol on Jan. 5 as part of a "reconnaissance" mission ahead of the attack. She did not name names. "I'm going to see they are held accountable, and if necessary, ensure that they don't serve in Congress," she said, speaking sedately but severely, according to NorthJersey.com.

Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-N.Y.) said she feared that GOP lawmakers who knew where she was would tip off rioters to her location. "I can tell you that I had a very close encounter where I thought I was going to die," she said last night in an Instagram Live video, noting that she couldn't get into specifics for security reasons. "I did not know if I was going to make it to the end of that day alive." (Antonia Farzan)

Right-wing activist Ali Alexander, a "Stop the Steal" organizer banned by Twitter, said three GOP lawmakers helped him plan his D.C. rally: Reps. Andy Biggs (Ariz.), Mo Brooks (Ala.) and Paul Gosar (Ariz.). "We four schemed up of putting maximum pressure on Congress while they were voting," Alexander said in a since-deleted video on Periscope. A Biggs spokesman said the congressman had never been in contact with Alexander or other protesters and denied he helped organize a Jan. 6 rally. "Neither Brooks nor Gosar responded to requests for comment from The Washington Post. But in a lengthy, defiant statement on Wednesday, the Alabama lawmaker insisted he also bore no responsibility for the riot," Teo Armus reports.

Gaslighting alert: A departing Trump administration political appointee at the nation's leading foreign aid agency told staff what happened at the Capitol was the work of "a few violent people," adding falsely "several million" others there were protesting peacefully for electoral reform, according to audio recordings obtained by Yeganeh Torbati.

Walmart halts donations to all lawmakers who voted against accepting Biden's win.

The country's largest retailer joined defense giant Northrop Grumman and other major corporations in taking a stand against lawmakers who participated in the effort to overturn the results of the election. Walmart's PAC last year donated \$1.2 million, split evenly between Democrats and Republicans, though its contributions in previous election cycles typically skewed Republican. (Aaron Gregg)

Harvard removes Rep. Elise Stefanik (R-N.Y.) from an advisory board.

The 2006 graduate of the college was ousted from a senior advisory committee at the school of government after she declined to step aside voluntarily, the Harvard Crimson reports. Hundreds of students and alumni called on the university to cut ties with Stefanik. She was part of the group that tried to disenfranchise millions of voters from Pennsylvania and Arizona even after the insurrection.

Kennedy School Dean Doug Elmendorf said in a letter to the Harvard community: "Elise has made public assertions about voter fraud in November's presidential election that have no basis in evidence, and she has made public statements about court actions related to the election that are incorrect. These assertions and statements do not reflect policy disagreements but bear on the foundations of the electoral process through which this country's leaders are chosen."

Stefanik responded by attacking her alma mater: "The decision by Harvard's administration to cower and cave to the woke Left will continue to erode diversity of

thought, public discourse, and ultimately the student experience."


The Trump Organization faces mounting consequences.

"In the past week, it has lost a bank, an e-commerce platform and the privilege of hosting a world-famous golf tournament, and its hopes of hosting another have been dashed," Dawsey, David Fahrenthold and Jonathan O'Connell report. "In the future, the Trump Organization also could lose its D.C. hotel and even its children's carousel in Central Park ... Trump lost a much bigger broker relationship Tuesday night when real estate giant Cushman & Wakefield told The Post it would no longer work with him. The company has handled an array of business for Trump for many years, including office leasing at Trump Tower and 40 Wall Street, and retail leasing in Chicago. It means that Trump's company will quickly have to find someone else to handle lease negotiations at some of his most prominent properties. ... One senior administration official said Trump was particularly infuriated about the PGA of America's decision to move the 2022 PGA Championship away from Trump's Bedminster, N.J., golf course. Trump wanted to know what legal rights his company had to stop the organization from moving it. The official ... said Trump had been a bit 'shellshocked' at the corporate backlash."

Americans of all stripes fear the worst is yet to come.

"Clinton Lynn, a retired fire captain, firmly believes the widespread conspiracy theory that the election was stolen from Trump, and he says that those who share his views are finding an ever-narrowing path to express their outrage, losing at the ballot box, the jury box and now the soapbox. If you take away those things, he says, what is left? 'I'm so mad, I see red about the [expletive] steal,' said Lynn, 64 ... 'I believe with all my heart that the Democratic Party stole the election,' [he added]. 'Liberals, you're driving us to civil war,''' Annie Gowen, Jenna Johnson and Holly Bailey report. "Americans across the political spectrum are also bracing for more and grappling with the realization that Jan. 20 ... may be not the end of the Trump era but the beginning of a new dark chapter in American history. ... [Lynn] said he was seeing calls for violent retribution continue to spread on conservative websites such as Newsmax and on social media apps such as Gab and Parler. ... "In the Philadelphia suburbs, Nora Schreiber McDonough, who is in her 60s, was so upset after watching the violence at the Capitol she took Thursday off from her job as an administrative assistant at a Catholic church. ... McDonough was long a Republican but couldn't bring herself to vote for Donald Trump in 2016. ... In 2020, she campaigned for Biden ... McDonough worries that the coming days will bring more violence, especially on Jan. 17 and 20. She worries that someone will try to assassinate Biden or [Kamala] Harris."

The Biden team sees risks in Trump's decision to widen the vaccine pool.

As the United States broke a new record for daily deaths from covid, tallying at least 4,250 fatalities, advisers to the president-elect balked at a decision by the lame-duck administration to dramatically increase the number of people eligible for the vaccine. "Officials instructed states to begin vaccinating tens of millions of people with a high-risk medical condition putting them at increased risk of dying from the coronavirus, along with all adults 65 and older. Including both those groups immediately adds another 100 million people [potentially] seeking shots, bringing the total to about 184 million and intensifying demand on already stressed sign-up systems," Lena Sun and Isaac Stanley-Becker report. "The Trump administration also said Tuesday it would begin releasing all available vaccine supply, rather than holding back second doses, as the incoming administration said last week it intended to do."

Biden's team also briefed Congress on his emerging covid relief plan.

"The proposal, which Biden intends to unveil on Thursday, is expected to include \$2,000 stimulus payments, an extension of enhanced unemployment insurance, money for vaccine distribution and delivery, funding for cities, states, schools, child care and more," Erica Werner and Jeff Stein report. "Transition officials indicated in meetings with Democratic staffers that Biden will try to get bipartisan support for the measure, instead of using a special budgetary tool [called reconciliation] that could allow him to push legislation through Congress with only Democratic votes ... That's led to speculation that the price tag of the package could be below \$2 trillion — although Biden said last week that it could cost in the multiple trillions of dollars. ... Biden's unveiling of the package is likely to kick off a furious round of lobbying and horse-trading as numerous lawmakers push for their priorities in the legislation."

With her members still fuming that Republicans refused to wear masks while they were sheltering in place, Pelosi amounced that anyone not wearing a mask on the House floor will be fined \$500 for their first offense and \$2,500 for their second. Rep. Jackie Speier (D-Calif.) wrote a letter, which 66 of her colleagues signed, imploring McCarthy to require his Republican members to wear masks. Rep. Brad Schneider (D-Ill.) tested positive on Tuesday after being stuck in the safe room for hours. Colby Itkowitz reports that he has been super careful: "His wife has a health condition that makes her high risk if she contracted the coronavirus. He drives the nearly 12 hours from his home in eastern Illinois to Washington rather than fly."

The U.S. will require a negative coronavirus test for international travelers arriving in the country.

"The order, set to go into effect Jan. 26, would greatly expand a requirement put into place last month that mandated testing for American citizens and others flying to the U.S. from the United Kingdom. Officials say they hope expanding the mandatory testing could help to thwart the virus and a faster-spreading variant that surfaced there and is now circulating in the United States," Lori Aratani reports. "More than 100 countries require visitors to show proof of a negative coronavirus test. CDC officials said **about 100,000 travelers come to the U.S. daily.** ... Both PRC and antigen tests will be acceptable."

Children apologize to their dying elders for giving them the virus.


"As hospitals across California braced this week for a surge in COVID-19 patients who got infected over Christmas, officials relayed painful stories of dying victims' last moments with their families," the Los Angeles Times reports. "One of the more heartbreaking conversations that our healthcare workers share is about these last words when children apologize to their parents and grandparents for bringing COVID into their homes for getting them sick. And these apologies are just some of the last words that loved ones will ever hear as they die alone,' Los Angeles County Supervisor Hilda Solis said."

- Half a million leisure and hospitality workers lost their jobs in December. (Abha Bhattarai and Laura Reiley)
- A veteran Fairfax County Sheriff's Office deputy died of covid amid an outbreak at the county jail that has sickened more than 30 guards and inmates in recent days. (Jouvenal)
- Tens of thousands of Americans with intellectual and developmental

disabilities — who are two to three times more likely to die of covid-19 — are waiting for an answer on when they will get their vaccines. (Jessica Contrera)

- Chicago opened public classrooms this week for the first time since the spring, but 18 percent of teachers and staffers who were required to return did not do so. The system notified 145 employees that they were considered absent without leave, and their pay would be docked beginning Tuesday. Some teachers who spent Monday teaching virtually instead of returning for inperson instruction were locked out of their Google Classroom accounts. (Dawn Reiss)
- Sinovac's CoronaVac, one of China's leading vaccine candidates, turned out to be 50 percent effective in late-stage trials in Brazil, significantly lower than earlier results showed. The efficacy rate still meets the 50 percent threshold the WHO considers good enough for widespread use. (WSJ)

Biden nominates Samantha Power to run USAID.

Biden announced this morning that he will put the former U.N. ambassador in charge of the U.S. Agency for International Development. "Biden is also expected to enhance Power's role by elevating the position to membership on the National Security Council," NBC's Andrea Mitchell reports. "Under [Trump], the agency's budget has been slashed and career development experts have been replaced by political appointees with little experience in the field. In the administration's proposed budget last year, foreign aid and USAID funds were cut by 22 percent."

- The Senate Armed Services Committee appears poised to approve a waiver allowing retired Gen. Lloyd Austin to serve as the next defense secretary, despite serious concerns lawmakers risk dismantling the tradition of civilian leadership of the Pentagon. (Karoun Demirjian)
- Biden will likely tap Gary Gensler to lead the Securities and Exchange Commission. A final decision, however, has not been made. "Gensler, pushed by liberals for the post, is viewed as a Wall Street critic and would probably be opposed by the banking industry if selected," Jeff Stein reports.
- Biden will appoint acting agency heads across the federal government once he takes office because of delays in Senate consideration of his nominees. (WSJ)

The Trump administration executes the first female death row inmate in seven decades.

Lisa Montgomery was executed in Indiana early this morning. Her attorney, Kelley Henry, who argued she is too mentally ill to understand her death sentence, criticized the Trump administration. Her sentence was carried out after the Supreme Court lifted one stay and declined to grant another last-minute request for a delay from her attorneys. Montgomery, 52, was convicted in 2007 of a grotesque crime: strangling a Missouri woman who was eight months pregnant, and cutting the baby from her abdomen. The infant survived and was raised by her father. (Ann Marimow and Robert Barnes)

- The Supreme Court agreed with the Trump administration and reinstated requirements that women seeking medication abortions receive the drugs in person at a clinic, setting aside a judge's ruling the protocol is dangerous during the pandemic. (Robert Barnes)
- Former Michigan Gov. Rick Snyder (R) will face criminal charges in connection with the Flint water crisis. Several former officials, including Snyder's former health department director Nick Lyon and former adviser Rich Baird, will also be indicted. (Kim Bellware and Brady Dennis)
- Less than six months after being poisoned in what he claims was a stateordered attack, Russian opposition activist Alexei Navalny said he's returning to Russia, where he could find himself behind bars soon after arriving. Navalny has been recovering in Germany since he became gravely ill during an August flight. (Isabelle Khurshudyan)
- Green Bay Packers quarterback Aaron Rodgers will serve as guest host on "Jeopardy!" (Des Bieler)



Why Does The US Department Of Justice Want To Worsen The Split In The US Population?

The initial charges against those few who entered the Capitol during the Trump rally were "entering a restricted building without permission and engaging in disorderly conduct while inside." This charge does not carry sufficient punishment for the kind of example the Establishment intends to make of Trump supporters.

Michael Sherwin, the acting U.S. attorney for the District of Columbia, sees a chance for his 15 minutes of fame. He announced in a press conference that he has built a team of national security attorneys to create sedition and conspiracy charges against Trump "rioters who stormed the Capitol."

Note that excessive language accompanies excessive charges. Whether those who got into the Capitol were let in or broke in, there was no "storming," and certainly no conspiracy to commit sedition. Sherwin says that he is "treating this just like a significant international counterterrorism or counterintelligence operation."

Even the videos shown on anti-Trump news sites, such as The Hill, show the "insurrectionists" in the Capitol walking peacefully and keeping within the roped lane. How is this violent insurrection? There are videos making the rounds that show Trump supporters restraining a man who is trying to break a window in the Capitol. It is clear that the Trump supporters regard the person as an Antifa

member.

In any demonstration there will be nutcases and provocateurs. To define a peaceful demonstration by the acts of a few is dishonest. Remember, the news media prostitutes repeatedly called the Antifa and Black Lives Matter riots that looted and burned business areas of Minneapolis, Chicago, Seattle, Portland, Atlanta and other cities "peaceful protests." When the news media prostitutes had to acknowledge that there was violence, they blamed it on Trump supporters or white supremacists who had allegedly infiltrated the peaceful protests.

Infiltration does seem to have happened to Trump supporters at the Capitol. According to a report by a person present at the Capitol to film the event that was sent to Professor Mark Crispin Miller at New York University, agitators suddenly appeared with bullhorns and provoked Trump supporters to rush up the steps at the back of the Capitol. The relatively few who entered the Capitol apparently entered from the front. Some reports say they were allowed in. Here is the account of the cameraman that I reported on January 7:

"I was in Washington, D.C. today filming the Trump rally and related events. I also ran across your post concerning the Capitol demonstration tonight. Perhaps this short account will help you assess what others are saying in a small way.

"I was also at the Capitol before the crowd appeared setting-up my camera on a stone wall around the perimeter of the back of the capitol (the rear facing Constitution Avenue). Then I waited for President Trump's speech to end and for supporters to walk-up Constitution Avenue to the Capitol. I was located at the precise location where supporters first rushed up the slope towards the back of the Capitol after casting aside a section of the first Capitol perimeter barrier. Supporters gathered roughly at the center of the back of the capitol, but a circle began to grow around the perimeter as the crowd grew larger. I had no sense that the growing crowd intended to rush the Capitol.

"After a large crowd emerged at the perimeter a man in perhaps his late 30's or early 40's showed-up, pacing quickly to his left then to his right before the crowd, and essentially began hurling insults at the crowd challenging their political wisdom. He excoriated the crowd for thinking that their attendance would be taken seriously by members of congress. (Hard to say that he was wrong about that, whoever he was). I cannot recall his precise words, but for a very short period he engaged in a shouting exchange with supporters, and suddenly supporters pushed aside the first barrier and rushed towards the back of the Capitol. Others on the northern edge of the perimeter followed suit. But the first rush was right at the center of the back of the Capitol. I followed the rush to the bottom of the Capitol back steps, and began filming again from atop an inner perimeter stone wall.

"The police, so it appeared, were a little surprised by the rush, and this gave supporters an opportunity to race up the steps. One or two men even made it as far as the steps leading up to the scaffolds on the south side of the Capitol before police arrested them. By this time, five or ten men had climbed to the top of the tall steel tower structure facing the Capitol. Then the police erected and lined-up behind a new barrier perimeter at the foot of the Capitol steps. Police at the top of the Capitol steps aimed rifles down on the crowd (perhaps rubber bullet rifles, I could not tell). The crowd began arguing with police and pressing hard against the new barrier. The police sprayed men pressing directly against the barrier with tear gas from time to time causing them to retreat. Meanwhile, the men at the top of the tower began rallying the crowd to challenge the new barrier (over bull horns) by filling any gaps between the barrier and the stone wall that I was using as a filming vantage point. Another man worked the crowd with a bull horn immediately in front of me and also encouraged supporters to climb over the inner perimeter stone wall (my filming vantage point) and create a wall of pressure on the new barrier at the bottom of the Capitol back steps.

"After about 30 minutes to an hour I dropped to the bottom of the stone wall to reload my camera when suddenly the barrier gave way and police attempted to fortify it by blasting tear gas into the area between the stone wall and the barrier. I was hit by the gas myself and struggled back over the stone wall in order to breathe. The gas threw many crowd members into a panic. And I was nearly trampled as I struggled to lift my camera and heavy gear bag over the wall after two women began pulling desperately on the back of my coat to pull themselves up and over the moderately high wall in retreat.

"After the second perimeter barrier gave way, the men with the bullhorns began working the crowd very hard to fill-up with Trump supporters the steps of the Capitol and the scaffolding on both sides of it. At this point one of the calls, which the men with bullhorns repeated from time to time in order to encourage people to climb the Capitol steps was "This is not a rally; it's the real thing." Another frequent call was "its now or never." After about a two-hour effort peppered with bullhorn calls of this nature the entire back of the Capitol was filled with Trump supporters and the entire face of the Capitol was covered with brilliant small and very large Trump banners, American flags, and various other types of flags and banners.

"Sometime after the rush on the back of the Capitol, people were apparently able to enter the Capitol itself through the front. But I was not witness to anything at the front or inside the Capitol.

"One clearly bona fide Trump supporter who had apparently entered the Capitol himself was telling others emotionally and angrily (including press representatives of some sort, even a foreign newsman) that he witnessed someone inside the Capitol encouraging violence whom he strongly suspected was not a legitimate Trump supporter (apparently on the basis that the man showed no signs at all of Trump support on his apparel). I did not pay that close attention to his claims (for example the precise claim of the violence encouraged) because, naturally, I had not yet read your post and it had not occurred to me that professional outsiders might play a role in instigating particular violent acts in order to discredit the event. "I overheard one Trump supporter (who followed the rush on the Capitol himself) say aloud, "I brought many others to this rally, but we did not sign on for this" as he watched matters escalate.

"Still, from my seat, I would say that large numbers of very legitimate Trump supporters felt that it was their patriotic duty to occupy the Capitol in light of their unshakable beliefs that (1) the 2020 election was a fraud, (2) that the vast majority of the members of congress are corrupt and compromised, and (3) that the country is in the throes of what they consider a "communist" takeover (although many use the expression "communism" as a synonym for "totalitarianism"). They are also convinced that the virus narrative is a fraud and an essential part of an effort to undermine the Constitution – in particular the Bill of Rights. They have a very real fear that the country and the very conception of any culture of liberty is on the verge of an irreparable collapse. For most (if not a very large majority) rushing the Capitol was a desperate eleventh hour act of partiotism –even of the order of the revolution that created our nation. Some Trump supporters sang the Star Spangled Banner and other patriotic songs as others climbed the Capitol steps. They also demonstrated a measure of respect for the Capitol itself. I saw no attempt by anyone to deface the Capitol simply for the sake of defacing it.

"The incontrovertibly compromised press has called this event a riot. But from what I saw and heard this would indeed be a gross and intentionally misleading oversimplification at best. At least from the standpoint of supporters, if their Capitol event was a riot, then so was the Boston Tea Party. It also seems to me that some professional help (very aware of deep sentiments) might have come from somewhere to make sure that the party happened."

It was a riot and violent and an insurrection, because that is what the Establishment wants it to be. Overstating what happened turns it into a weapon that can be used against Trump and his supporters as Acting US Attorney Michael Sherwin intends to do.

If Sherwin were to conduct a real investigation, he would probably find that the organized plan he is looking for was an Antifa plan or a plan of some Establishment group to use provocateurs to stampede rally attendees into some action that would discredit Trump and the rally. Of course, this is nothing that Sherwin wants to find.


The violent looters who rampaged through American cities have not been held accountable. Yet the US Justice Department is intent on framing people who are protesting what they believe was a stolen election as "insurrectionists" with a conspiracy of sedition. If Sherwin and the Establishment he serves had any judgment, they would not throw gasoline on a fire unless they want a bigger fire. It seems that a bigger fire is what they do want.

A bigger fire would help the new domestic terrorism bill that criminalizes dissent. Under this bill, those who challenge Establishment explanations could find themselves charged with terrorism. Law is what prosecutors establish it to be. What is terrorism becomes a subjective judgment and is whatever a prosecutor says it is.

There was no insurrection on January 6, which is puzzling in a way. If tens of millions of Americans believe that their democracy is threatened by a stolen election and nothing was being done about it, who would be surprised if there was an insurrection? It seems to me that everyone but the Establishment and its minons would support such an insurrection.


To charge Trump supporters for something that did not happen, while not charging Antifa for what did happen, is the best way to split the population. Why does Michael Sherwin want to split the American population?

Hello Paul,

I know how occupied you must be with the investigation of the Capitol insurrection and the larger-scale preparation for Inauguration week. If I didn't believe it was of significant importance, I wouldn't be sending you this email while you're in that crush. There's no good way to say it, so I'll just be direct: from my first-hand and second-hand information from conversations since January 6th there is, at best, a sizable percentage of the employee population that felt sympathetic to the group that stormed the Capitol, and said it was no different than the BLM protests of last summer. Several also lamented that the only reason this violent activity is getting more attention is because of "political correctness". Here's a sampling of what is happening across multiple field offices:

I literally had to explain to an agent from a "blue state" office the difference between opportunists burning & looting during protests that stemmed legitimate grievance to police brutality vs. an insurgent mob whose purpose was to prevent the execution of democratic processes at the behest of a sitting president. One is a smattering of criminals, the other is an organized group of domestic terrorists.

I was talking to an Λ /SSA in a "red state" office who was telling me that over 70% of his CT squad + roughly 75% of the agent population in his office, disagreed with the violence "but could understand where the frustration was coming from" which led to the "protestors getting carried away".

An analyst in "purple state" described watching horrified as the events were unfolding on the news, while several co-workers chalked up the insurgency as a "response to everyone being quarantined at home for months" and more "on edge, because so many lost their jobs and lack steady income because of COVID".

after the TVs in that squad's space were tuned to farright media channel Newsmax. Those TVs previously were tuned to Fox News but post-election the group found that Fox News was "playing to the left" and reporting "fake news".

I've spoken to multiple African American agents who have turned down asks to join SWAT because they do not trust that every member of their office's SWAT team would protect them in an armed conflict.

 Λ senior analyst from my first unit who retired less than 2 years ago has a Facebook page full of #StoptheSteal content.

There are not one-off events -- they are representative of a larger group within the organization.

Do I think they were in the group storming the Capitol? No. But I know that that group of insurgents included state & local police officers and current and retired military personnel. I have seen from news coverage that at least one current federal agent is under investigation for participating in the siege, and that a current Secret Service agent is under admin leave/suspension as his agency investigates the social media postings he made supporting the insurrection. Nothing about how the Bureau is comprised is unique from any of those other organizations, which means that the susceptibility to that messaging exists for Bureau employees as well.

I don't know what the next steps are at your level to address this, but I know from the several people I spoke to in the field offices they feel an absence of guidance and reiteration of our values from HQ and their SACs. Having spent a lot of last week following hunches to find and send FB accounts & Twitter handles of concern to the Bureau Capitol tips inbox, I for the first time was immersed in that cultish QAnon conspiracy posting and calls for armed uprisings & civil war. That content needs to be included, addressed head-on. Not to be redundant, but a terrorist attack happened on our Capitol. And there is a level of understanding and empathy being afforded the perpetrators within the halls of the FBI that would be unthinkable if the attackers were inspired by a foreign terrorist

There have to be uncomfortable conversations that occur -- mandatory non-virtual academy training on the growth of right-wing extremism/domestic terrorism might be a good start. Small groups, intentionally broken up so it's not all of your squadmates or normal interaction circles, that are in facilitated small group discussions.

Please let me know if you need any additional details regarding any of the above mentioned incidents, or if there is anything I can do to help.

p.s. There is second long conversation that stems from this one about why I have such hesitation recommending bright & capable individuals to the FBI, from or elsewhere. It has to do with the atmosphere I describe above, it has to do with rampant unaddressed sexual harassment like the kind documented in the lengthy AP article from December 9th (or the several undocumented instances I know of), it has to do with the disproportionate number of minority candidates that are failed/not believed in their pre-employment polygraphs

it has to do with the abysmal demographics of the professional workforce (tied to both recruitment and application process) and the absence of qualified minority employees being selected for leadership positions alone has been passed over what 4-5 times?).

I will take on any burden to help address these issues, but I certainly do not want to guide people who trust me into an organization where I couldn't protect them from these conditions. I know that this is a concern shared by other former FBI employees (IAs, agents, & computer scientists). And whenever you have the time to discuss further, you let me know when & where to show up. 
Traffic Disruptions Throughout Washington, D.C. Area Due to Upcoming Inauguration


