


Few House Republicans defended Trump's conduct as they opposed his second impeachment

House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy (R-Calif.) said President Trump "bears responsibility for Wednesday's attack on Congress by mob rioters" and faulted him for not immediately denouncing the violence "when he saw what was unfolding."

McCarthy endorsed a resolution to censure Trump but said impeaching the president a second time would only "further fan the flames of partisan division."

"Instead, we must unite once again as Americans," McCarthy said at the start of a floor debate that stretched all afternoon. "I understand, for some, this call for unity may ring hollow."

McCarthy voted last week – just hours after the mob had finally been cleared from the Capitol – in favor of rejecting the will of more than 10 million voters in Arizona and Pennsylvania to play along with Trump's baseless claims of widespread election fraud in those states.



Ultimately, with 10 Republicans in support, the House voted 232 to 197 to impeach the president for inciting a riot with false claims of a stolen election that led to the storming of their building and five deaths. Most of those 197 Republicans opted not to speak during the floor debate, quietly casting their votes while avoiding television cameras. One of them, Rep. Michael McCaul (R-Tex.), shed some light on why in a statement: "I truly fear there may be more facts that come to light in the future that will put me on the wrong side of this debate."



Among those who did rise to speak against impeachment, few offered a rousing defense of Trump. Rep. Darrell Issa (R-Calif.) noted on Wednesday that, while campaigning for Sen. Marco Rubio (R-Fla.) during the GOP presidential primaries in 2016, he had accused Trump of being erratic. "I don't think that's being debated here today: We all know that's true," Issa said. "What's being debated is whether, with 167 hours left until he leaves office, he is a clear and present danger, and he clearly isn't. The president has acted substantially the same for four years."


It was a marked contrast to the floor debate 13 months earlier when many Republicans unabashedly defended the propriety of his efforts to pressure Ukraine's president to announce an investigation of Joe Biden and to put a hold on military assistance to Kyiv while doing so.

A significant chunk of the GOP speakers largely ignored Trump's behavior and focused instead on critiquing the timing of the vote, the language of the resolution and the lack of a traditional process for bringing it to the floor. Other members rationalized their opposition to impeachment by attacking their Democratic counterparts for not more forcefully condemning violent street protests last summer after the killing of George Floyd in police custody.

"The president of the United States deserves universal condemnation for what was clearly, in my opinion, impeachable conduct: Pressuring the vice president to violate his oath," said Rep. Chip Roy (R-Tex.). "Unfortunately, my Democratic colleagues drafted articles that I believe are flawed and unsupportable, focusing on the legal terms of incitement and insurrection."



In December 2019, not a single House Republican broke ranks. Only Sen. Mitt Romney (R-Utah) supported removing Trump after the trial on the other side of the Capitol. The 10 Republicans who backed impeachment this time were Reps. Peter Meijer (Mich.), Anthony Gonzalez (Ohio), Tom Rice (S.C.), David Valadao (Calif.) Liz Cheney (Wyo.), John Katko (N.Y.), Fred Upton (Mich.), Adam Kinzinger (Ill.), Jaime Herrera Beutler and Dan Newhouse (Wash.).



To be sure, a segment of stalwart allies rallied to Trump's defense. "Instead of stopping the Trump train, his movement will grow stronger, for you will have made him a martyr," said Rep. Andy Biggs (R-Ariz.), the head of the Freedom Caucus and a backer of the "Stop the Steal" effort that culminated in the Jan. 6 rally.

Rep. Doug LaMalfa (R-Calif.) even went so far as to say that the violence at the Capitol was just a pretext to conceal why Democrats really were trying to get rid of Trump on his way out the door. "You hate him because he is pro-life," LaMalfa said. "You hate him for Israel. You hate him for defending our borders. … You hate him for putting America first." Rep. Glenn Grothman (R-Wis.) faulted Democrats for not trying to understand what motivated so many Trump supporters to descend on Washington in the first place. "He did say he wanted people to 'fight like hell or we're not going to have a country anymore,' but that's obviously standard hyperbole," said Grothman. "You don't understand why they were here. They're scared to death we're going to go back to the days without Donald Trump, of hundreds of thousands of people crossing this border every month. ... They're scared to death that nobody else will fight the cancel culture as we head towards an era when some things can't be said. They're scared to death that the majority party got here by teaming up with Black Lives Matter."



Democrats unanimously supported Trump's second impeachment. Last time, two members voted no (Jeff Van Drew and Collin Peterson) while a third voted present (Tulsi Gabbard). Van Drew switched parties, Peterson lost and Gabbard retired.

Freshman Rep. Cori Bush (D-Mo.) said failing "to remove a white supremacist president who incited a white supremacist insurrection" would send a terrible message to predominantly Black communities like the one she represents in St. Louis. "The 117th Congress must understand that we have a mandate to legislate in defense of Black lives," she said. "The first step in that process is to root out white supremacy starting with impeaching the white supremacist in chief."

Thirteen months ago, Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-Calif.) shushed a group of Democrats who started to cheer after the House passed the impeachment resolution. No one cheered Wednesday. In large part, this was because no one felt like celebrating. "Every one of us in this room right now could have died," explained Rep. Jamie Raskin (D-Md.), the author of the article of impeachment.

Rep. Jim McGovern (D-Mass.), the chairman of the Rules Committee, noted that the debate was unfolding "at an actual crime scene." He added: "The cause of this violence resides at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue."

In a reminder of the trauma, members of the National Guard had spent the night sleeping in the halls of the Capitol. The temple of democracy is being used as a barracks for the first time since the Civil War.

After the first impeachment, Pelosi was mocked for using several pens to sign the resolution during the engrossment ceremony and then handing them out to members of her conference. This time, the speaker used only one pen.

Before she signed the document, Pelosi spoke to reporters from behind a lectern that one of the rioters had carried out of the House chamber. Adam Johnson, a Florida man, has been charged with theft of government property in connection with taking the lectern. It was discovered this week on the Senate side of the complex, where it had been discarded, and returned on Wednesday.

"Today, in a bipartisan way, the House demonstrated that no one is above the law, not even the president of the United States," Pelosi said, "that Donald Trump is a clear and present danger to our country and that, once again, we honor that oath of office to protect and defend the Constitution of the United States, so help us God."

What's next for impeachment

Mitch McConnell says he'll consider voting to convict Trump but refuses to bring back the Senate.


"I have not made a final decision on how I will vote and I intend to listen to the legal arguments when they are presented to the Senate," the Republican leader said in a message to his colleagues. "McConnell also pressed pause on an impeachment trial that would occur before Trump leaves the White House on Jan. 20," Seung Min Kim and Paul Kane report. "His office informed aides to Senate Minority Leader Charles E. Schumer (D-N.Y.) earlier Wednesday that he would not agree to immediately reconvene the Senate this week ... McConnell is poised to remain majority leader until at least Jan. 22, when election results from the two Senate runoff races in Georgia will be certified ... McConnell and Schumer could jointly work out the rules that would govern Trump's second impeachment trial, although once Democrats formally take the majority, Schumer and his ranks could formalize a rules package on a party-line vote."

Senior GOP officials say it's too early to determine whether the required 17 of 50 Republicans in the new Senate would would vote to punish Trump. In addition to Sens. Mitt Romney (Utah), Ben Sasse (Neb.), Lisa Murkowski (Alaska), and Pat Toomey (Pa.), others have directly criticized Trump for his role in inciting the riot, including Richard Burr (N.C.) and Rob Portman (Ohio).

Whether an official can be impeached after leaving office has not been settled by the courts, and constitutional scholars do not agree. But there are historical precedents: The impeachments of Tennessee Sen. William Blount in 1797 and Secretary of War William Belknap in 1876 both occurred after they were no longer in office. (Gillian Brockell)

Another open legal question is whether the chief justice or the vice president will preside over a trial, Robert Barnes reports. A Supreme Court spokeswoman declined to comment about whether Chief Justice John Roberts has been in contact with Senate leaders about the second trial. The Constitution says "when the President of the United States is tried, the Chief Justice shall preside." But Trump will no longer be "the president" after Jan. 20. That could mean that Vice President-elect Kamala Harris, in her new role as president of the Senate, would preside. Michael Gerhardt, a University of North Carolina law professor who wrote a book on impeachment, thinks it will be up to the majority leader and parliamentarian.


"Minutes after the House voted to impeach him for a second time, Trump held a private ceremony in the Oval Office to award the National Medal of Arts to country singer Toby Keith ... The White House released a video Wednesday evening featuring Trump seated behind the Resolute desk in the Oval Office pleading with supporters not to engage in further violence. ... A senior administration official said [son-in-law Jared] Kushner, the president's daughter Ivanka Trump, Deputy Chief of Staff Dan Scavino and Pence persuaded Trump to film the video, telling him it could boost support among weak Republicans. They asked him not to mention impeachment, and he didn't.

"Still, in a stark illustration of Trump's isolation, **the White House did not mount a vigorous defense Wednesday as House members debated his fitness for office** ... The president's aides did not blast out talking points to allies. His press secretary did not hold a briefing with reporters. His advisers did not do television interviews from the White House's North Lawn. His lawyers and legislative affairs staffers did not whip votes or seek to persuade lawmakers to vote against impeachment. This is both because there was no organized campaign to block impeachment and because many of his aides believe Trump's incitement of the riot was too odious to defend. White House Counsel Pat Cipollone, who was central to the president's defense in his first impeachment a year ago, told other staffers to make sure word got out that he was not involved in defending Trump this time, according to one aide. ...

"Other than family members, the president is mainly talking to [Chief of Staff Mark] Meadows, Scavino, senior policy adviser Stephen Miller and personnel director Johnny McEntee. **Hope Hicks, counselor to the president and long one of his closest confidantes, has been checked out for some time, according to people familiar with her status.** ... Several aides laid blame for the situation not only on Trump but also on Meadows, because the chief of staff indulged Trump's delusion that the election was rigged and fed him misinformation about alleged voter fraud. 'He is the one who kept bringing kook after kook after kook in there to talk to him,' one adviser said. In the days after Twitter banned Trump from its platform, McEntee pushed the president to migrate to other social media sites, such as Parler. But Kushner and Scavino pushed back and stopped the president from joining the fringe platform."

"National Guard forces from a growing list of states moved into positions around Washington on Wednesday as authorities scrambled to understand the extent of threats surrounding Biden's inauguration and prevent a repeat of last week's deadly insurrection," Missy Ryan, Alex Horton, Matt Zapotosky and Dan Lamothe report. "Federal officials led tabletop exercises to rehearse inauguration security and strengthen coordination ... Authorities have been operating in a heightened state of alert as the Secret Service orchestrates inauguration security and the FBI runs down possible threats in D.C. and state capitals. On Wednesday, FBI Director Christopher A. Wray briefed local law enforcement across the country about the 'state of play,' and the agency moved to establish new command posts nationwide. Senior FBI and Secret Service officials also briefed Biden ...

"Officials and analysts monitoring online posts and message threads said **some far-right groups appeared to be backing down from plans to come to Washington in coming days, at least in part owing to the National Guard and law enforcement presence.** ... The consensus seemed to be that while the risk of violence may be lower in Washington in coming days, state capitals remain vulnerable. Fearing fresh rounds of violence this weekend, more governors on Wednesday announced that they were calling up National Guard troops to help maintain security. ... The U.S. Marshals Service, part of the Justice Department, plans to deputize between 3,000 and 4,000 local law enforcement officers from across the country who — at the request of D.C. police, will help with security for the inauguration."

- A joint intelligence bulletin issued by federal authorities said last week's Capitol breach will be a "significant driver of violence" for armed militia groups by inspiring racist extremists (NYT)
- National Guardsmen were told to prepare for the possibility that improvised explosive devices will be used in D.C. The briefings indicate that authorities believe the IEDs places outside the RNC and DNC headquarters last week were not isolated events. (Politico)
- Biden reluctantly agreed to cancel his plans to arrive in Washington aboard an Amtrak train. The president-elect wanted to take the 90-minute ride from his

namesake station in Wilmington, Del., a commute he often took during his decades in the Senate. (CNN)

- In keeping with tradition, Biden does plan to stay at Blair House the night before the inauguration, according to a spokesperson for the State Department, which manages the property. (Matt Viser)
- The D.C. Metro will close 13 stations near the Capitol and Mall because of the expanded security perimeter. (Justin George)
- Airbnb will cancel all D.C. reservations during inauguration week. The company said it discovered and has banned accounts for many people involved in hate groups and who participated in last week's Capitol siege. (Emily Davies, Michael Brice-Saddler, Marissa Lang and Justin Jouvenal)

The sedition task force continues to round up suspects, including police officers, a firefighter and a transit worker.

"Federal authorities announced several new charges Wednesday against people allegedly involved in last week's riot at the Capitol, including a man said to have worn a pro-Nazi sweatshirt, a five-time Olympic medalist and two police officers from southwest Virginia," Spencer Hsu, Rachel Weiner and Hannah Knowles. "Many of the those charged in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on Wednesday face misdemeanors and were released without bond, with prosecutors asking only that they be temporarily barred from Washington. ... Among those arrested and released Wednesday were Thomas Robertson, 47, and Jacob Fracker, 29, of Rocky Mount, Va., both officers with the Rocky Mount Police Department. They have been placed on administrative leave.

"Robert Keith Packer, 56, of Newport News, Va., was identified by an acquaintance and other news outlets; several photographs taken at the Capitol appear to show him wearing a sweatshirt that read 'Camp Auschwitz' ... Klete Keller, a five-time Olympic medalist in swimming, was charged just days after he was spotted on video wearing a Team USA jacket in the Capitol Rotunda."

"An indictment unsealed against Douglas A. Jensen, 41, accuses the Des Moines resident of leading a charge of protesters against Capitol Police Officer Eugene Goodman. In a viral video, Goodman is seen ... trying to hold back dozens of rioters, twice retreating up a flight of stairs. Police experts say he wasn't fleeing, but luring the mob away from the Senate chambers, where lawmakers were sheltering. 'He wanted to have his T-shirt seen on video so that 'Q' could 'get the credit," FBI Special Agent Julie Williams wrote of Jensen in an arrest affidavit."

- Houston Police Chief Art Acevedo relieved from duty an officer on his force whom he said "penetrated" the Capitol after attending Trump's rally last week. (Click2Houston)
- Investigators are pursuing evidence the riot was pre-planned. An FBI team is examining indications some participants left Trump's rally at the Ellipse early, perhaps to retrieve items to breach the Capitol. Investigators are also focusing on the command-and-control aspects of the attack, looking into communication and travel records to see if they can bring conspiracy and terrorism charges. (CNN)
- FAA chief Steve Dickson signed an order to create an "enforcement program" targeting passengers who "assault, threaten, intimidate, or interfere" with crew members. A broader crackdown could include placing anyone who participated in the Capitol riot on the government's no-fly list. (Lori Aratani)
- "FBI inspectors who evaluated the domestic terrorism program in the bureau's Washington field office two years ago gave it a 'failing grade,' meaning it was considered both ineffective and inefficient, two former FBI officials familiar with the matter said," per NBC News. "The inspection akin to an internal audit found that mechanisms to collect, analyze and share threat intelligence were lacking ... The evaluation also criticized the Washington field office's procedures for sharing intelligence with other police agencies, including the U.S. Capitol Police."
- Neither acting attorney general Jeff Rosen nor Wray, the FBI, director has appeared at the type of high-profile news conference that typically marks a major criminal investigation. "In the weeks leading up to the riot, Mr. Trump pressured Mr. Rosen to find more evidence of election fraud," the Times reports. "He fears that being fired now would destabilize the Justice Department."
- "The U.S. military had its own intelligence that anticipated election-related unrest from individuals who viewed the presidential election as fraudulent the same individuals who stormed the Capitol — according to an internal Defense Department intelligence assessment," per the Intercept.

The Capitol siege played out as a QAnon fantasy made real.

"The '#Storm' envisioned on far-right message boards had arrived. And two women who had died in the rampage — both QAnon devotees — had become what some were calling the first martyrs of the cause," Drew Harwell, Isaac Stanley-Becker, Razzan Nakhlawi and Craig Timberg report. "The failed insurrection illustrated how the paranoid conspiracy theory QAnon has radicalized Americans, reshaped the Republican Party and gained a forceful grip on right-wing belief. ... A man in a 'Q' T-shirt led the breach ... while a shirtless, fur-clad believer known as the 'Q Shaman' posed for photographers in the Senate chamber. ... The theory's namesake — a top-secret government messenger of pro-Trump prophecies — has largely vanished, posting nothing in the past 35 days and only five times since Trump's election loss. ... [But] the fervent online organizing seen ahead of last week's assault has begun building again. A QAnon group on Gab has grown by more than 40,000 members since the failed insurrection."

- Parler, the Twitter alternative that went dark after being cut off by major service providers, may never get back online, said CEO John Matze. (Reuters)
- Twitter CEO Jack Dorsey said he took no pride in banning Trump from the platform, saying it represents a "failure" to ultimately create a service that can sustain civil discourse and healthy conversations. (Elizabeth Dwoskin)
- Snapchat will permanently terminate Trump's account on Jan. 20. Trump has already been suspended from the platform. (CNBC)
- Facebook COO Sheryl Sandberg deflected blame for the riot, but new evidence shows that her platform played a role in promoting the march on the Capitol. More than 100,000 users posted hashtags affiliated with the movement, including #StopTheSteal and #FightForTrump. Two dozen GOP officials and organizations in at least 12 states posted on Facebook to coordinate bus trips to the rally. (Elizabeth Dwoskin)
- The walkie-talkie app Zello, which critics say has long ignored a growing farright user base, hosted groups of rioters who communicated through its services. (Guardian)
- Women are calling the FBI tip line to help authorities identify pro-Trump rioters they discovered by scrolling through dating apps. Bumble and Tinder profiles have shown men in MAGA hats or with #StopTheSteal in their biographies. (The Lilly)


Democrats demand criminal investigations into whether House

Republicans aided rioters.

"Their accomplices in this House will be held responsible," said House Judiciary Committee Chairman Jerry Nadler (D-N.Y.), in a speech during the impeachment debate, without mentioning specific members or allegations. Rep. Mikie Sherrill (D-N.J.) organized a letter that was signed by many of her colleagues asking that law enforcement examine logbooks, videos and facial recognition software. (Michael Kranish, Karoun Demirjian and Devlin Barrett)

- Pelosi announced that lawmakers will face costly fines if they refuse to go through the newly installed metal detectors to enter the House chamber. They will be fined \$5,000 for their first offense and \$10,000 for the second. The money will be deducted directly from their paychecks. (The Hill)
- Rep. Madison Cawthorn (R-N.C.) claimed he was armed while inside the House chamber on Jan. 6. (Citizen Times)
- Rep. Greg Stanton (D-Ariz.) filed a bill requiring Capitol Police to wear body cameras. (Tom Jackman)
- Major League Baseball suspended political contributions from its PAC, the first major sports league to announce such a response to the insurrection. (Des Bieler)
- The Trump appointee at USAID who minimized the riots in remarks to employees, Tim Meisburger, will no longer be at the agency "until further notice," according to an internal memo. (Yeganeh Torbati)
- Chapman University announced that professor John Eastman, who spoke at the D.C. rally before the riot, will retire immediately. In exchange, the school and professor agreed not to sue each other. (Andrea Salcedo)
- Middlebury College revoked Giuliani's 2005 honorary degree. (Newsweek)
- Kyle Rittenhouse, the 18-year-old charged with fatally shooting two men and wounding a third during an August protest following the police shooting of a Black man in Wisconsin, was caught flashing hate symbols and posing with Proud Boys at a bar. The Kenosha County District Attorney's Office asked a judge to forbid Rittenhouse from drinking alcohol, using "white supremacist" signs and spending time with members of the white nationalist group. 
The outbreak among lawmakers shows one vaccine dose may not be enough.

The U.S. reported 4,254 covid-19 deaths on Wednesday, and 225,277 new cases, per The Post's tracker. Daily reported deaths rose 24.9 percent over the last week, with Tuesday marking a record high number of deaths at 4,200.

"Three members of Congress may have contracted the coronavirus while sheltering in a crowded room as a pro-Trump mob stormed the Capitol, testing positive shortly after getting a first dose of the coronavirus vaccine," Ben Guarino reports. "Those positive tests do not mean the vaccines were faulty, experts said, noting that immune protection takes more than a week to kick in. Both the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines that are available to Americans require two doses for full protection; a single dose is not as effective as both. 'Early protection against covid-19 may occur from about 12 days after dose one,' said Naor Bar-Zeev, an infectious diseases physician and epidemiologist at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. ... Even though the vaccines may protect people from showing symptoms, those vaccinated could remain susceptible to infection, he said."

- The husband of Rep. Ayanna Pressley (D-Mass.), who was locked down in the Capitol with her, has tested positive. Some GOP lawmakers in the room refused to wear masks, and experts now believe the confined space became a hot spot. (Colby Itkowitz)
- The Johnson and Johnson one-shot vaccine generated a promising immune response in an early trial. The vaccine was safe and appears to generate a promising immune response in both young and elderly volunteers, according to trial data published in the New England Journal of Medicine. (CNBC)
- D.C. lawmakers advocated for changing coronavirus vaccine policies during a contentious meeting, saying White residents are edging out Black residents in vying for scarce appointments during the first week vaccines are being administered to seniors. (Julie Zauzmer, Rachel Chason, Lola Fadulu and Erin Cox)
- China barred two members of the WHO's coronavirus mission from entering the country. The researchers, part of a larger group of scientists headed to Wuhan, were kept in Singapore after failing to clear health checks. But the two had tested positive for antibodies in their home countries before leaving. (Lily Kuo)

In a speech tonight, Biden will outline an economic stimulus proposal.

"Biden officials are likely to include the expansion of an existing tax credit for children as part of a relief package that will also include \$2,000 stimulus payments, unemployment benefits and other assistance for the ailing economy — as well as money to fight the coronavirus pandemic and increase vaccine distribution," Jeff Stein and Erica Werner report. "Biden transition officials have not disclosed the overall price tag of the package, but it is expected to be more than \$1 trillion. While a final decision has not been made, Biden is expected to push for a proposal similar to his campaign pledge to provide \$300 per month to American households for every child under 6, as well as \$250 per month for every child between the ages of 6 FBI(21cv558)-5240 and 17. That would amount to \$3,600 per year for families with one young child and \$3,000 per year for families with older children. Biden is also likely to seek to extend the existing child benefit to millions of poor families currently shut out of the program."

The number of new unemployment claims filed last week jumped by 181,000 the week before to 965,000, the largest increase since the beginning of the pandemic. An additional 284,000 claims were filed for the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance, the insurance for gig and self-employed workers. (Eli Rosenberg)

Harris is making history. What will she do with it?

"Harris, 56, has yet to offer any grand vision of what kind of vice president she hopes to be, although few vice presidents have by Inauguration Day," Chelsea Janes reports. "People familiar with her role in the transition say that loyalty is Harris's primary goal. ... The most consistent through line of her political career has been a commitment to opening the doors of American leadership to more people like her. ... She chose a chief of staff, communications director, press secretary, and head of policy who are all women of color."

For her friends and allies, the Capitol attacks prompted fresh fears. "That Harris is not only Black, but also a woman and a daughter of immigrants, combine to make her a unique focus of racist and misogynistic animus — a symbol of a changing America that white supremacists loath to see," Janes reports.

Unlike many federal lawmakers, who treat D.C. more like a business shop than a second home, Harris has traversed the lines that separate the many versions of the nation's capital: Black and immigrant and White Washington; poor and rich Washington; official Washington and the "real" Washington. Once she calls the Naval Observatory home, her friends expect her to become even more engaged in the city's life. (Sydney Trent)



Dozens of people on a terrorist watch list were in Washington for pro-Trump events Jan. 6, a day that ended in a chaotic crime rampage when a violent mob stormed the U.S. Capitol, according to people familiar with evidence gathered in the FBI's investigation. The majority of the watchlisted individuals in Washington that day are suspected white supremacists whose past conduct so alarmed investigators that their names had been previously entered into the national Terrorist Screening Database, or TSDB, a massive set of names flagged as potential security risks, these people said. The watch list is larger and separate from the "no-fly" list the government maintains to prevent terrorism suspects from boarding airplanes, and those listed are not automatically barred from any public or commercial spaces, current and former officials said.

The presence of so many watch-listed individuals in one place — without more robust security measures to protect the public — is another example of the intelligence failures preceding last week's assault that sent lawmakers running for their lives and left five others dead, some current and former law enforcement officials argued. The revelation follows a Washington Post report earlier this week detailing the FBI's failure to act aggressively on an internal intelligence report of Internet discussions about plans to attack Congress, smash windows, break down doors and "get violent . . . go there ready for war."

FBI report warned in advance of 'war' at the Capitol

Other current and former officials said the presence of those individuals is an unsurprising consequence of having thousands of fervent Trump supporters gathered for what was billed as a final chance to voice opposition to Joe Biden's certification as the next president. Still, the revelation underscores the limitations of such watch lists. Although they are meant to improve information gathering and sharing among investigative agencies, they are far from a foolproof means of detecting threats ahead of time.

Since its creation, the terrorist watch list, which is maintained by the FBI, has grown to include hundreds of thousands of names. Placing someone's name on the watch list does not mean they will be watched all of the time, or even much of the time, for reasons of both practicality and fairness, but it can alert different parts of the government, such as border agents or state police, to look more closely at certain individuals they encounter. It's unclear whether any of the dozens of individuals already arrested for alleged crimes at the Capitol are on the terrorist watch list.

"The U.S. Government is committed to protecting the United States from terrorist threats and attacks and seeks to do this in a manner that protects the freedoms, privacy and civil rights and liberties of U.S. persons and other individuals with rights under U.S. law," a U.S. official said, adding that because of security concerns, the government has a policy of FBI(21cv558)-5324 neither confirming nor denying a person's watch list status.

The FBI declined to comment.

Trump is isolated and angry at aides for failing to defend him as he is impeached again The riot's political aftershocks led the House of Representatives on Wednesday to

impeach President Trump for allegedly inciting the violence — his second impeachment in a single four-year term — and may have significant consequences within law enforcement and national security agencies.

Inside the FBI and the Department of Homeland Security, officials are grappling with thorny questions about race, terrorism and free-speech rights, as some investigators question whether more could have been done to prevent last week's violence. While some federal officials think the government should more aggressively investigate domestic terrorism and extremists, others are concerned the FBI, DHS and other agencies may overreact to the recent violence by going too far in surveilling First Amendment activity like online discussions.

Several law enforcement officials said they are shocked by the backgrounds of some individuals under investigation in connection with the Capitol riot, a pool of suspects that includes current and former law enforcement and military personnel as well as senior business executives and middle-aged business owners.

"I can't believe some of the people I'm seeing," one official said.

The TSDB, often referred to within government as simply "the watch list," is overseen by the FBI's Terrorist Screening Center, which was created in the wake of the 9/11 attacks carried out by al-Qaeda. The watch list can be used as both an investigative and early warning tool, but its primary purpose is to help various government agencies keep abreast of what individuals seen as potential risks are doing and where they travel, according to people familiar with the work who, like others, spoke on the condition of anonymity because the work is sensitive.

Often that can be done as a "silent hit," meaning if someone on the watch list is stopped for speeding, that information is typically entered into the database without the individual or even the officer who wrote the ticket ever knowing, one person said. After the 2013 Boston Marathon bombing, for instance, the FBI quickly searched a similar database to see which people on it had recently traveled to that city or raised other suspicions about possible involvement.

Before the Jan. 6 gathering of pro-Trump protesters, FBI agents visited a number of suspected extremists and advised them against traveling to the nation's capital. Many complied, but according to people familiar with the sprawling investigation, dozens of others, whose names appear in the terrorist watch list, apparently attended, based on information reviewed by the FBI.

Separately, while the FBI is hunting hundreds of rioting suspects who have dispersed back to their hometowns, federal agents are increasingly focused on alleged leaders, members, and supporters of the Proud Boys, a male-chauvinist group with ties to white nationalism, these people said.

The Proud Boys participated in last week's protests, and FBI agents are taking a close look at what roles, if any, their adherents may have had in organizing, directing or carrying out violence, according to people familiar with the matter.

The group's chairman, Enrique Tarrio, had planned to attend Trump's Jan. 6 rally but was arrested when he arrived in D.C. and charged with misdemeanor destruction of property in connection with the burning of a Black Lives Matter banner taken from a Black church during an earlier protest in Washington. He is also accused of felony possession of two extended gun magazines.

Tarrio told The Post on Wednesday that his group did not organize the Capitol siege. "If they think we were organizing going into the Capitol, they're going to be sadly mistaken," he said. "Our plan was to stay together as a group and just enjoy the day. We weren't going to do a night march, anything like that. That's it as far as our day."

Tarrio said he's actively discouraging members from attending planned armed marches scheduled Sunday, and the Million Militia March next week when Biden is inaugurated. Proud Boys, he said, are on a "rally freeze and will not be organizing any events for the next month or so."

It is unclear how many Proud Boys devotees will abide by the freeze, or if such a shutdown might lessen the FBI's interest in the group. Even before the Jan. 6 riot, federal and local investigators were working to understand the group's plans, goals and activities. Privately, some federal law enforcement officials have described the group as roughly equivalent to a nascent street gang that has garnered an unusual degree of national attention, in part because Trump mentioned them specifically during one his televised debates with Biden during the campaign. Other officials have expressed concern that the group may be growing rapidly into something more dangerous and directed. The FBI has already arrested dozens of accused rioters, and officials have pledged that in cases of the most egregious conduct, they will seek to file tough, rarely used charges like seditious conspiracy, which carries a potential 20-year prison sentence. The bureau continues to face blowback over its handling of a Jan. 5 internal report

warning of discussions of violence at Congress the next day. Steven M. D'Antuono, the head of the FBI's Washington Field Office, claimed in the days after the riot that the bureau did not have intelligence ahead of time indicating the rally would be anything other than a peaceful demonstration.

The Jan. 5 FBI report, written by the bureau's office in Norfolk, and reviewed by The Post, shows that was not the case, and the Justice Department took other steps indicating officials were at least somewhat concerned about possible violence the next day. The Bureau of Prisons sent 100 officers to D.C. to supplement security at the Justice Department building, an unusual move similar to what the department did in June to respond to civil unrest stemming from racial justice protests.

Mindful of the criticism that law enforcement took a heavy-handed, all-hands-on-deck approach to Black Lives Matters protests in D.C. in the spring and summer, Justice Department officials deferred to the Capitol Police to defend their building and lawmakers there. Some former officials have questioned whether the FBI and Justice Department should have done more.

"It would not have been enough for the bureau simply to share information, if it did so, with state and local law enforcement or federal partner agencies," said David Laufman, a former Justice Department national security official. "It was the bureau's responsibility to quarterback a coordinated federal response as the crisis was unfolding and in the days thereafter. And it's presently not clear to what extent the FBI asserted itself in that fashion during the exigencies of January 6 and in the immediate aftermath."



NATIONAL ISSUES

<u>Wray Security Briefing: OPA</u> – Director Wray and other officials involved in inaugural security briefed Vice President Pence. The director discussed both the concerning threat stream about upcoming events surrounding the inaugural and the FBI's aggressive investigation into events at the U.S. Capitol last week. Inaugural: OPA – Several outlets asked about the FBI's role in the inauguration and other related events. OPA provided the following statement after review by CTD and CIRG: "The Presidential Inauguration is a National Special Security Event involving multiple agencies. The FBI is the lead federal agency for crisis management, counterterrorism, and intelligence analysis. As we do every four years, the FBI has been planning and coordinating with the U.S. Secret Service, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the military and other law enforcement partners for months. In keeping with our standard practice, we will not release the exact number of FBI personnel who will be involved, but it will include numerous FBI special agents, analysts, specialized teams, and support staff, many of whom are already in place. The FBI's National Crisis Coordination Center was established at FBI Headquarters and a command post was initiated at the Washington Field Office to provide a centralized location for gathering intelligence, assessing potential threats, coordinating on investigations, and providing any additional resources needed. Command posts will also be set up in all 56 FBI field offices. As always, the FBI is working in close coordination with its law enforcement and intelligence partners in order to ensure the safety of the event."

<u>Proud Boys: OPA</u> – Bloomberg asked if the Proud Boys and some other groups are planning to "stand down" and not participate in violent action around the inauguration. OPA declined to comment.

<u>Total Arrests: OPA</u> – Multiple outlets inquired about specific individuals arrested and the total number of arrests in relation to the violence at the U.S. Capitol. OPA referred reporters to the Department of Justice webpage that provides updated arrest and charging information. https://www.justice.gov/opa/investigations-regarding-violence-capitol.

<u>Suspicious Visitors to U.S. Capitol: OPA</u> – Continued interest in claims that Republican members of Congress provided access to the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 5 through tours. OPA declined comment and directed reporters to the U.S. Capitol Police.

<u>Digital Tips Received: OPA</u> – Multiple outlets asked about the number of tips the FBI has received. OPA advised that more than 126,000 digital tips have been received from the public about the violence at the U.S. Capitol.

<u>Capitol Riot Art Crime: OPA</u> – CNN asked if the FBI's Art Crime Team has been engaged in the Capitol violence investigation. In coordination with WFO and the Art Crime Team, OPA provided the following statement: "The FBI Washington Field Office and the Art Crime Team are fully engaged in investigating the

potential theft and defacement that occurred in the U.S. Capitol during the rioting on January 6. The Capitol and all of the valuable historic artifacts held within are symbols of our democracy and their vandalism will not be tolerated. As such, the FBI has already arrested an individual alleged to have stolen the lectern used by the Speaker of the House. Because this is an ongoing investigative matter, we cannot comment further."

<u>No-Fly List: OPA</u> – Received additional requests for information about the No-Fly List and if those involved in the violence at the Capitol were added. OPA advised: "If an individual is deemed to be an immediate threat to other airline passengers or to the aircraft, the agencies and local law enforcement at the airport have jurisdiction to detain or arrest the individual, which would effectively prevent them from flying. Separately, the F8I will continue to nominate predicated subjects to the federal terrorism watchlist, as appropriate, in accordance with existing laws and policies. The TSC will continue to evaluate all nominations to the watchlist to ensure they meet the required criteria for watch listing." OPA directed the reporter to <u>https://www.fbi.gov/wanted/capitol-violence</u> for previous statements.

<u>Dating Apps: OPA</u> – The Washington Post asked if there was an uptick in tips using location-based dating apps to find potential insurrectionists. OPA advised the FBI does not comment on information or specific tips we may receive from the public and provided information about the FBI's request for digital media tips.

<u>Online Claims: OPA</u> – The AP sought guidance on a popular video that is spreading online claiming, "the FBI has just cleared President Donald Trump of any guilt, any connection to the Jan. 6 attack on our state Capitol." OPA directed the reporter to the FBI's Capitol violence landing page at <u>https://www.fbi.gov/wanted/capitol-violence</u>.

<u>New Section: OPA</u> – The editor-in-chief of SpyTalk asked if the WMDD had opened a new section to pursue reports of right-wing extremists' efforts to acquire CBRN materials. OPA declined to comment on the purported section and provided the reporter with general background on the WMDD mission.

<u>OIG Sexual Harassment Investigative Summary: OPA</u> – The Daily Caller asked for comment about an OIG Investigative Summary published today that found an FBI ASAC engaged in unwanted physical sexual contact with three FBI employees, made offensive sexual comments to FBI employees, and consumed alcohol and provided alcohol to others while on duty in a federal building. OPA provided the following statement: "The FBI has zero tolerance for any form of sexual harassment or sexual misconduct. And we expect our employees—regardless of rank or title—to foster a workplace that's respectful, professional, and free from offensive, inappropriate, or harassing behavior. While we are limited in what we can say on an ongoing matter, we assure both the FBI workforce and the public we are seriously reviewing the allegations raised in the OIG's report and will take all appropriate measures to address any misconduct."

<u>DarkMarket Takedown: OPA</u> – Following a German press release announcing the takedown of a major illegal Dark Net marketplace called DarkMarket, an online security publication asked for a comment on the FBI's role in the operation. In coordination with JCODE and CID, OPA provided the following statement: "The successful takedown of the illegal marketplace DarkMarket is the result of a strong and continuing partnership between the FBI and our domestic and foreign law enforcement partners. This ongoing global effort has been influential in dismantling criminal enterprises attempting to hide on the Dark Web and shows that the those operating on the Dark Web are not above the law."

<u>COVID Vaccine Cargo Theft: OPA</u> – The Bureau of Investigative Journalism asked how the FBI plans to mitigate the threat of vaccine cargo theft at U.S. airports. In coordination with CID, OPA provided the following statement: "The FBI, in coordination with federal, state, and local agencies and private sector partners, is on high alert for any threats to the production and shipment of COVID-19 vaccines. The FBI stands ready to investigate reports of potential threats to the vaccine supply chain and will dedicate resources and expertise in response to attempts to steal or disrupt vaccine shipments." <u>Cyber Strategy Follow-up: OPA</u> – DAD Ugoretz of the Cyber Division provided an interview to CyberScoop looking back over the Cyber Division's efforts in 2020 and discussing the FBI's cyber posture moving into 2021. OPA also gave CyberScoop exclusive information about AD Gorham's upcoming retirement.

<u>Insider Threat: OPA</u> – A reporter interviewed Cyber SC Frigm and Counterintelligence A/SC Rozhavsky about how businesses can work with the FBI on insider threat problems. The interview included the importance of companies establishing relationships with their local FBI offices before they experience any problems. A story will be posted later this month on the Dark Reading website, which is targeted at information security officials.

U.S. CAPITOL VIOLENCE

<u>Albany</u> – SAC Relford joined A/USA Bacon for a media availability to discuss how their offices are helping bring to justice those responsible for last week's riot and assault on the Capitol building and to provide safety plans for the planned protests in the coming days.

Baltimore – More than a dozen local and national media outlets requested confirmation of the arrests ofKevin and Hunter Seefried in connection to the riot at the Capitol. PASconfirmed the arrests andb6 -1directed reporters to USAO-District of Columbia.b7C -1

<u>Boston</u> – Confirmed yesterday's arrest of Thomas Gallagher of Bridgewater, New Hampshire, pursuant to an arrest warrant issued by the U.S. Court for the District of Columbia on charges related to the U.S. Capitol riots. SAC Bonavolonta was also asked at this morning's press conference on the MIT professor about the FBI Boston's response to the riots and concerns about upcoming events relating to the Inauguration.

<u>Buffalo</u> – PAO Dempsey fielded dozens of media inquiries yesterday and today about the execution of a federal search warrant at the Cheektowaga home of Peter Harding. The JTTF located and arrested Harding at a friend's house late yesterday. Harding appeared this afternoon in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of New York on charges filed in the U.S. District Court in the District of Columbia, including "(K)nowingly entering or remaining in any restricted building or grounds without lawful authority; Violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds." He was released on conditions, including electronic monitoring.

<u>Cleveland</u> – Received numerous inquiries about the arrest of Christine Priola for her involvement at the Capitol last week. A federal court reporter saw the affidavit after it was uploaded to PACER at about 12:30 p.m. today. Cleveland expects the USAO –District of Columbia will include her arrest in the evening update.

Indianapolis – Continue to receive inquiries about arrests of anyone from Indiana related to the Jan. 6 violence at the Capitol. PAO provided the previously issued statement: "Like FBI field offices across the country, FBI Indianapolis is receiving tips regarding Hoosiers who may have been at the Capitol building in Washington, D.C., Jan. 6. Any subjects that are arrested/indicted will be prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office in Washington, D.C." PAO also provided the link to the DOJ page with information on those charged to date.

Los Angeles – Fielded dozens of press inquiries about the arrest last night of Hunter Ehmke of Glendora by FBI agents and the Glendora Police Department. A criminal complaint filed in Washington, D.C., charges Ehmke with one count of damaging or destroying government property; one count of obstruction of an official proceeding; and one count of violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds. FBI Los Angeles also tweeted basic details about the arrest.

Pittsburgh - Continued to received media requests about whether we are investigating certain people and if

we are expecting protests this weekend. PAO said we do not confirm or deny investigations and referred reporters to our press release from this week.

<u>Salt Lake City</u> – Utah media asked to confirm the arrest of John Sullivan, who posted video on social media about breaching the U.S. Capitol. PAO declined comment and referred them to NPO and Washington Field.

<u>Washington Field</u> – Received multiple requests for interviews and inquiries from around the country about the violence at the Capitol. Reporters also asked about FBI security measures for the 59th Presidential Inauguration. Washington Field had two new Seeking information Posters posted and updated posters with arrests. Continued to staff the command post at WFO.

OTHER LOCAL STORIES

<u>Multiple field offices</u> – Field offices continued to receive media inquiries about expected armed protests in all 50 states and other possible violence. Reporters also asked about security plans for state capitols; some outlets had more specific questions. Albany, Baltimore, Boston, Pittsburgh, Houston, Portland, Salt Lake City, and Seattle reported related inquiries.

<u>Albuquerque</u> – Issued a news release announcing that a teenager charged federally with being a felon in possession of ammunition is being sought for allegedly absconding from pre-trial release in Albuquerque. Adrian Nieto Jr., 19, of Albuquerque, is accused of leaving an Albuquerque halfway house without permission on Dec. 24, a day after he was placed on pre-trial conditions of release. The Albuquerque Police Department is assisting with the investigation.

<u>Baltimore</u> – SAC Boone provided the following quote for the Dover Police Department after a major drug bust. Boone: "As a result of strong partnerships with federal, state and local law enforcement 'Operation Rise-N-Shyne' resulted in 39 indictments in the matter of five months. This joint enforcement effort illustrates how effective our law enforcement alliances are in pursuing the crime afflicting our communities. The FBI will continue to work with our partners to disrupt and dismantle dangerous drug operations and protect the citizens of Delaware."

<u>Baltimore</u> – The Washington Post requested <u>a statement</u> on how states bordering D.C. are balancing threats in their areas and assisting Washington. PAS provided a statement from NPO-approved talking points.

<u>Boston</u> – SAC Bonavolonta delivered remarks at a press conference hosted by the USAO –District of Massachusetts to announce today's arrest of Gang Chen. The professor and researcher at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology is charged with grant fraud and failing to file a foreign bank account report. Chen allegedly failed to disclose his work for the PRC to the U.S. Department of Energy when he applied for \$19 million in federal grants.

<u>Boston</u> – Several reporters asked what local agencies were invited to participate on yesterday's call with Director Wray. PAO advised that our office of partner engagement pushed the invite out to all fusion centers.

<u>Boston/CJIS</u> – The Boston Globe asked for statistics on the monthly background checks for firearms and wanted to know if the recent events at the U.S. Capitol have affected the numbers. PAO connected reporter with the CJIS PAO, who provided a link to the NICS statistics and advised that the January statistics will not be posted until the beginning of January.

<u>El Paso</u> – PAO Harper and Criminal ASAC Boyd participated in a weekly Skype interview to discuss human trafficking. The interview was conducted in English for the El Paso, Las Cruces, Midland/Odessa, and Juarez

media markets. The interview will air today.

<u>Houston</u> – SAC Turned issued a statement to address public safety concerns in the Houston area. The statement read, in part, "At this time, the FBI has not received any specific and substantiated threat to the FBI Houston Area of Responsibility (AOR)—which includes Beaumont, Bryan/College Station, Corpus Christi, and Texas City/Galveston—or other government buildings in our area. However, we are working together with our law enforcement partners to continuously share information based on tips submitted by the public."

<u>Houston</u> – A DOJ press release announcing the indictment of a Houston woman for transporting a minor for the purpose of female genital mutilation included a quote from SAC Turner. This is the first-ever indictment regarding the specific allegation.

<u>Indianapolis</u> – The ABC affiliate requested an update on the rescheduled jury trial for a former mayor arrested in Nov. 2019. The affiliate also asked about the status of the operation and if the investigation into public corruption related to the case continues. PAO said the FBI does not confirm or deny investigations and referred the reporter to the release issued at the time of the mayor's arrest.

<u>Indianapolis</u> – Several outlets asked about FBI presence at an apartment complex in Terre Haute. PAO confirmed a federal search warrant was executed at the location and referred the reporter to the USAO– Southern District of Indiana.

<u>Indianapolis</u> – A reporter with the Fox/CBS duopoly requested an interview about how the FBI tracks encrypted internet groups, how surveillance is conducted, and what makes these types of outlets more difficult to track than other forms of social media. PAO declined the interview.

Little Rock – Received numerous media inquiries about a TikTok video that surfaced showing a beaten female who is alleged to be Cassie Compton. In 2016, Cassie disappeared from her Arkansas hometown at the age of 15. FBI Little Rock issued the following statement to local media: "FBI Little Rock is aware of the TikTok video and is taking all logical investigative steps. At this point in time, we cannot provide any more details, and any further inquiries should be directed to the Stuttgart, AR, Police Department."

Los Angeles – In a JTTF case that garnered significant press attention, a Hollywood man pleaded guilty today to a federal criminal charge that he recklessly operated a drone that crashed into and damaged a Los Angeles Police Department helicopter. Andrew Rene Hernandez, 22, pleaded guilty to one misdemeanor count of the unsafe operation of an unmanned aircraft. The case marks the nation's first criminal conviction for the unsafe operation of an unmanned aircraft.

<u>Pittsburgh</u> – KDKA interviewed victim specialist Simunovic and SA Piccini human trafficking. Simunovic talked about her role in investigations and the importance of working with each victim for as long as it takes. SA Piccini talked about what we are seeing in Pittsburgh with regards to human trafficking. Simunovic also discussed a victim success story.

<u>Portland</u> – SAC Cannon issued a statement today based on the talking points provided yesterday about the current period of unrest. Cannon included information about setting up the command post, the current threat picture, and the need for people to come forward with tips. Cannon and incoming SAC Ramsey are doing a series of interviews today with all the Portland-based TV stations plus the Oregonian, Oregon Public Broadcasting, and the Salem Statesman Journal.

Salt Lake City – ASAC Fitzgibbons did interviews with 13 media outlets in Salt Lake City about possible planned protests in Utah. He discussed the FBI's posture, emphasized that the FBI does not police ideology, and called for the public to submit tips. Fitzgibbons also condemned the violence in D.C. and discussed how

FBI Salt Lake City is working with federal prosecutors to bring appropriate charges.

San Juan – Received media calls to confirm the FBI's involvement in law enforcement activity with the Police of Puerto Rico in various locations across the AOR. Agents deployed in support of a large operation by the Police of Puerto Rico to impact areas with high violent crime. This is in direct response to the killing of three police officers Monday afternoon. During one of the many interventions today, there was a brief fire exchange between police and two subjects. One of the subjects is under arrest while the other is at large. Media also wanted to confirm the exchange of gunfire. PAO confirmed FBI support of the police operation and declined further comment.

<u>Seattle</u> – The local ABC affiliate interviewed ASAC Nichols about the local perspective on the Capitol violence. Nichols used OPA-provided talking points, highlighted the FBI Seattle command post, and urged the public to provide information through the tip line.




Top News 59th Presidential Inauguration NSSE Designation Expanded
