**ORDER REGARDING ADOPTED MOTIONS**

In advance of the hearing scheduled for December 1, 2023, the State filed a motion seeking to determine the manner in which the Court handles adopted motions. (Trump Doc. 95, 11/29/23). As indicated at the hearing, to allow the efficient preservation of all issues for the record, the Court will consider any motion timely filed by a Defendant which adopts in whole or in part the motion of another Defendant, even if the adopted motion has already been addressed or ruled upon. However, adopting Defendants should not automatically expect the opportunity for oral argument or to be included in a discretionary interlocutory appeal, if any. As for the other aspects of the State's motion, each Defendant only remains able to challenge the particular counts of the indictment with which they have been charged. If requested, any opposing party will be permitted to respond in writing to arguments or theories raised for the first time at any oral argument. The State's motion is therefore GRANTED IN PART.

Similarly, Defendant Clark also filed a motion requesting clarification on adopted motions and discovery. (Clark Doc. 49, 9/27/23). Motions decided as solely pertaining to a specific Defendant are not binding on any other Defendant unless otherwise indicated. General discovery related concerns can be addressed at a joint case management conference to be scheduled following the pretrial motions deadline. Particularized discovery motions will be considered and scheduled as filed. Defendant Clark's motion is therefore GRANTED IN PART.
