COMES NOW, the State of Georgia, by and through Fulton County District Attorney Fani T. 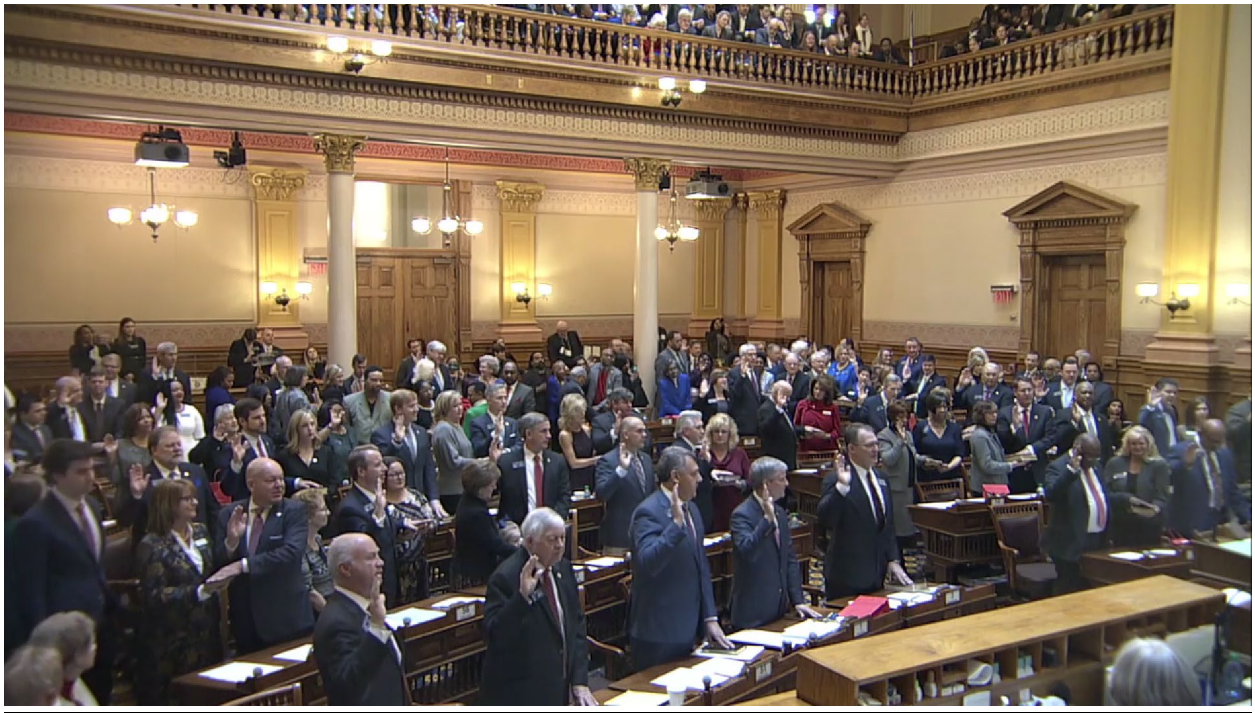

Representative Burns of the 159th moved that the nominations be closed.

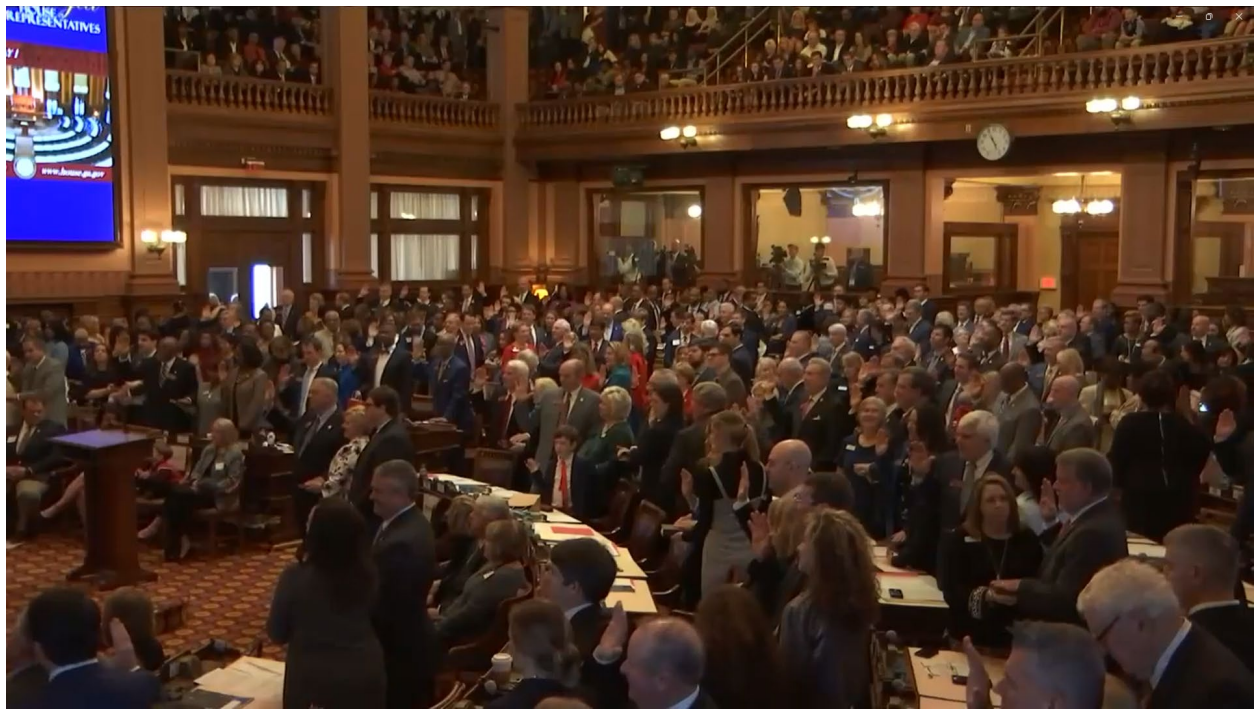
