Pamela Bondi, in her official capacity as Attorney General of the United States; Kristi Noem, in her capacity as Secretary of the United States Department of Homeland Security; Todd M. On February 8, 2026, the Court granted Petitioner Ibrahime D.’s Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus and ordered Respondents to release Ibrahime D. **“with all of his personal effects seized during his arrest, including but not limited to immigration paperwork[.]”** (Dkt. 6 at 4 (emphasis in original).) He has since been released, although a day late in violation of the Court’s order. (See Dkt. 9.)

On February 13, 2026, Ibrahime D. filed a Reply informing the Court that his Minnesota identification card and international driver's license were returned in damaged condition, with their top-right corners cut off. (Dkt. 10-1 (photo).) It is unclear why Ibrahime D.'s identification documents were returned in a damaged condition.

Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT by February 18, 2026 at 12 pm,** counsel for Respondents must file a Notice explaining to the Court why Petitioner's identification documents were returned in a damaged condition. Respondents' Notice must include a declaration from the person or persons responsible for the damage or who instructed the damage to the documents explaining what occurred and why the documents were returned to Petitioner in a damaged condition.
