**ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE**

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On February 4, 2026, the Court granted Petitioner Guadalupe O.G.'s Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus and ordered his immediate release. (Dkt. 9 at 8–9.) That Order specified that O.G. be released “with all of his personal effects seized during his arrest, including but not limited to immigration paperwork, and without conditions.” (*Id.* at 9 ¶ 3.) After initially failing to notify the Court of O.G.'s release, Respondents filed a status report on February 13, 2026 confirming that he was released on February 5, 2026. (Dkt. 13.)

Later on February 13, O.G. filed a Motion to Show Cause alleging that Respondents released O.G. with additional conditions in violation of the Court's Order. (Dkt. 14.) He also filed photographs of an Order of Release on Recognizance given to O.G. upon his release, which included a list of 11 conditions. (Dkt. 17.)

The imposition of these conditions appears to directly violate the Court's February 4 Order.

Accordingly, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that:

1. Petitioner Guadalupe O.G.'s Motion to Show Cause (Dkt. 14.) is **GRANTED in part**;
2. On or before February 17, 2026, the government must:
  - a. File a declaration demonstrating that the conditions have been vacated in their entirety; and
  - b. File a reasoned memorandum of law with supporting documentation explaining why the imposition of conditions set forth in Petitioner's filing does not violate the Court's February 4, 2026 Order requiring Petitioner's unconditional release.
